A Spirally Food

As I reflect back on a busy month and look forward to the start of April, I want to share with you all some exciting news on the back of our Bells Anniversary Weekend. The 200th Birthday celebrations on the 4th and 5th of March not only attracted national attention to Appleton's great heritage of bells, bell-hanging and change-ringing; they also resulted in the church securing a lucrative sponsorship deal with a world-famous Tex-Mex restaurant chain. This means that, from the first of this month and for the next five years at least (we have an option to extend the contract), the ten bells in the St Laurence tower will be known as *The Taco Bells of St Laurence*. In addition, the tower itself will soon be sporting a 3m x 2m billboard, bearing the distinctive purple logo of the U.S.-based *Taco Bell* food company (see: www.tacobelluk.co.uk)

My hope is that this new partnership will generate even more interest in our church buildings and community, not least because all new bell-ringing recruits at St Laurence will receive vouchers for up to two free meals per week at a *Taco Bell* restaurant of their choice - the outlets in Woking, Poole and Southampton are the closest to Appleton. I can also reveal that the St Laurence Tea and Coffee team will be serving burritos, nachos and - of course - tacos after every All Age Service from now until the 1st of April 2023. If you're still confused, then Roy's Plaid Loaf, A Display Floor, and A Disloyal Prof (Alias Droop Fly) may help; as might any recollection you may have of the abundant Swiss Spaghetti Harvest of 1957...

And so to Easter. As you are no doubt aware, this year (for the first time since 1945) Easter Sunday falls on April Fools' Day. To many people this synchronicity will seem particularly appropriate. GARDENING CLUB Our March lecture was again



slightly tangential to our main interest-area, but it followed the Club's tradition of having the occasional talk on natural history, rather than just mainstream gardening. Ashley Grove, an experience wildlife guide and photographer, gave us a beautifully illustrated talk on "How to be a birdwatcher". This was full of tips about how to entice the birds into your garden in the first place. (Who knew that goldfinches have apparently tired of niger seeds and now expect sunflower hearts to be served up in feeders!) Moving on to identification, we were reminded that this is, to a large extent, the art of ruling things out (and, if you've got any sense, you first rule out the rare species because it's very unlikely you've seen them). I think many of us struggled to differentiate (and still less remember) the bird calls and songs that Ashley illustrated with recordings, but what a wonderful skill to have. And did you know that wrens have regional accents? (Or was that just a wind-up?)

On **11th April** at **7.30 pm**, Victoria Logue of Whitehall Farmhouse Plants (high up in the Cotswolds) will speak on "**Extending the season: a professional's perspective**". The meeting will be in Appleton School Hall. Guests are very welcome at £2 a head. The Club's annual **Plant Sale** will take place on Saturday **12th May** at **10.00 am** in Appleton Village Hall. Do put the date in your diary and come along then for good locallygrown plants at reasonable prices. Offerings of good quality plants (vegetables or ornamentals) to be sold are always welcome, so please keep us in mind if you're dividing or potting on plants in your own garden.
