#### THEY THINK IT'S ALL OVER... Part 2

Last month, for many of us, was all about the footballers. By which, I don't mean the highly-paid, heavily-inked superstars of Russia 2018, who yelped and writhed in agony whenever an opponent brushed against their thigh (how do they cope at the tattoo-parlour, I wonder); who took an age to leave the pitch when substituted, apparently sponsored for the number of handshakes completed en route to the touchline; and whose ability to draw imaginary rectangles in the air became more and more impressive as the tournament wore on. It's true of course that there were also many excellent matches during this year's World Cup, with some wonderful goals and some sublime individual skills on display. But even the story of plucky Croatia, a nation of only 4 million people, overcoming the odds to reach the Final, pales into insignificance alongside the story of the Wild Boars football team — the twelve Thai boys trapped with their coach for two weeks in the Tham Luang caves.

Whether or not it was wise to lead his party into those caves in the first place, it would appear that, throughout the ordeal, "Coach Ekk" did a remarkable job in keeping his young squad calm, safe and together. As a junior soccer coach myself (and also a former school-teacher), I cannot imagine being able to manage the situation as successfully as Ekk did – not least because I am borderline claustrophobic, and would never ever *ever ever* sign up to go potholing...

Anyway, as you can imagine, the details of the *Wild Boars* story are something of a gift, a parable even, for the Christian minister seeking to explain why Jesus Christ is such good and urgent news.\* There's the imagery of people wading into trouble, unable to find a way out; in their search for refuge, they wander deeper and deeper into the darkness, and further and further from safety. While their common experience affords them a small measure of comfort and support, they are in fact isolated, trapped, hungry and helpless. That is, they are utterly dependent on the courage, competence and loving concern of a rescue team *from the outside*, prepared at great personal risk to enter into and save them from their dark and dangerous world...

# Save Our Scheme

The Appleton Voluntary Transport Scheme urgently needs more drivers.

The transporting of patients who have no independent means of getting to their medical appointments is falling on fewer and fewer volunteers.

There is no commitment to be available all the time - most people have busy lives outside volunteering, and you can specify the days of the week when you can't help. But if you can go on the list of people we can call upon occasionally it would remove the pressure on the small pool of drivers we have.

Most journeys are to Abingdon, Wootton or Witney. For these, waiting times are short. There are journeys to the Oxford hospitals, but no-one is asked to wait for the duration of lengthy appointments. Some trips are just to collect patients after such appointments.

Your ordinary car insurance normally covers this voluntary driving, and you are paid the expense of using your car.

There are a lot of elderly people who really cannot get to their medical appointments under their own steam, and this sort of voluntary service is what makes the village into a community.
