Foreword from the St Laurence PCC

In *The Times' Credo* of June 20th Stephen Platten compared lockdown to a monastic way of life - with people living in various degrees of isolation - some as families, some as couples and others entirely alone. For me, living as a couple, I have been well looked-after by my wife - I had to say that didn't I. However, there have been times when I have deliberately 'self-isolated' in my study – or perhaps my cell!

Stephen Platten recalls the story of a respected spiritual leader from Ethiopia named Father Moses. A brother went to Moses to ask for advice. Moses responded, "Go and sit in your cell, and your cell will teach you everything". Sitting in my cell – my study – I do not claim to have been taught everything or indeed anywhere near everything, However I have had the opportunity to ponder on many things – not least those who have influenced my life and my thinking over the past 80 years or so, Some have been teachers or leaders, others family, others close friends and others have only been met through the written word.

For me, in terms of the written word, one such person has been the theologian John Bowker. In my study there are various versions of the Christian Bible. In addition is a copy of Bowker's *The Complete Bible Hand-Book.* Over time, this hand-book, backed by dozens of contributors, has provided me with an easy-to-read extremely useful source of information; full of amazing diagrams, drawings, pictures and photographs. Now, recently, during my lockdown ponderings I discovered by chance that Bowker and I have one small thing in common. This is that we have both spent time in northern Nigeria – I as an engineer and Bowker doing his National Service. And Bowker wrote this:

"I grew up in a Christian and churchgoing family; so, from an early age, I began to question God and claims about God.....During National Service, I was posted to northern Nigeria. There was a young Muslim soldier who worked each day near the company office, and who seemed often to be talking to himself. As I gradually learned Hausa, (the local language), I realized that he wasn't talking to himself: he was talking to God. I couldn't possibly believe that God wasn't listening, or that God understood English only. I therefore knew that my early imaginings of God were too small."

In Luke Ch.2 vv16-20 it is written, "So they (the shepherds) hurried off and found Mary and Joseph, and the baby, who was lying in the manger. When they had seen him, they spread the word concerning what had been told them about this child, and all who heard it were amazed at what the shepherds said to them. But Mary treasured up all these things and pondered them in her heart".

Let not our imaginings of God be too small and may we pause to ponder this in our hearts.

Margaret, George and Alexandra thank everyone who sent kind messages after John died on 21st May. He was born in Ceylon on his father's Monte Cristo tea estate. Aged 8 he, his mother and sisters set sail for S.Africa where they lived at Pietermaritzburg for four years. It was thought Ceylon would be overrun by the Japanese. His father remained on the estate until after VJ day. On VE day he arrived at Southampton on the Strathaird from Cape Town. As he had had yellow fever on the way back an ambulance was waiting to take him to grandmother's in Gloucestershire. He quickly had to learn Latin so he could go to boarding school at Cothill. He became a chartered accountant and ended his career at Corpus Christi College, Oxford where the flag flew at half mast as he was buried on Exmoor, a place with which the family had been associated for many years. John was a fine sportsman who enjoyed racing his ' Sunbeam' at Cowes in the 60s and 70s , and skied until he was 80.
