Dear Friends,

I have to admit: I was rather disappointed. And, what's more, I really didn't get it. Yes, the soundtrack was predictably beautiful, and the child-actor predictably cute. But what did those two minutes of highly-anticipated schmalz actually *mean*? And why was the ending supposedly a "happy" one, when the little boy's new best friend, Moz the Monster, seems to have disappeared (forever, I assume) on Christmas Day morning? I'm referring of course to this year's Christmas advert for John Lewis, in which - bizarrely, for a company with over 350,000 product-lines - the only Christmas gift really featured is a child's bedside night-light. This has been clumsily wrapped in brown paper and left under the Christmas tree by the aforementioned Moz, presumably just before he boarded the last bus out of town...

At which point, surely any emotionally intelligent viewer would be thinking: Poor kid! After several days of late-evening high jinks with a lovable and indulgent Sesame Street character, the young boy (Joe) is supposed to be satisfied with a... John Lewis night-light?! True, the midnight Scalextric races and piggy-back games with Moz were taking their toll on Joe: we see him struggling to stay awake during the day, on the football pitch and at the barber's; he even falls asleep at the kitchen table while writing his wish-list to Santa (which, it should be noted, makes no mention of night-lights!) But really - what would most normal seven year-old lads prefer: their own personal 7ft muppet, or a bedside lamp?!

In my confusion (and concern for Joe), I turned to the John Lewis website for illumination. The press release did indeed shed some light and, I confess, it brought me up short: "Just as you think the ad has come to a close, Joe turns the light back off and hears the familiar rumblings of his friend and is reminded that he can bring Moz back any time he thinks of him." Clearly, Moz has *not* left Joe for good. Equally clearly, *I* had not paid enough attention to the story-line: I had missed a key detail and, as a result, drawn a number of false conclusions. (I also discovered that the advert does in fact feature *several* products stocked by John Lewis - and the night-light is not even one of them!)

And so to this year's Christmas advert for St Laurence. Not as highly anticipated or hyped as the John Lewis ad; nor, thankfully, as expensive to produce. In fact, given our limited budget, words rather than images will have to suffice. There's no background music either, unless you're reading this with the radio on. Still, at least there's no schmalz...

Picture a little boy, much younger than Joe, dressed not in John Lewis

pyjamas, but in strips of cloth; and lying not in a John Lewis duvet-set, but in a farmyard trough. Picture a little boy who, at Christmas, does not *receive* a light for his bedroom, but came to *give* light to the whole world. Picture a little boy, who is given the name Jesus (meaning "God saves"), because, according to the angel, he will save his people from their sins. Picture a little boy who is also to be called Emmanuel (meaning "God with us"), because that's who Jesus is - God in human flesh, in relationship with his people.

Yes, the content may be exactly the same every year, but that really shouldn't lead to disappointment or confusion. Not if we pay attention to the details, and follow the story through to the end. So may I invite you to join us at St Laurence in the coming weeks, as we celebrate Advent and then Christmas. As ever, the times of our Sunday services can be found on the back cover of the Advertiser, and on the Calendar page of the Church website.

News from the Appleton with Eaton Parish Council

Dog fouling in Town Furlong:

Town Furlong residents have had the unfortunate experience of finding dog poo in their gardens.

This is because a dog walker is walking their dog off lead in the road. Dogs need to be kept on a lead when walking in residential areas. The resident who kindly cuts the verge in Town Furlong has reported that the verges are covered in dog poo.

If you witness a dog fouling and the owner does not pick it up, take note of the date, time and what the dog and dog owner looks like and it can be reported and a fine issued.

Road safety concern: Oaksmere

The clerk and two parish councillors' had a site meeting with Lee Turner, Principal Officer (Traffic Schemes) of Oxfordshire County Council, to discuss the safety of pedestrians walking down Oaksmere. Lee Turner said that Oxfordshire County Council has no road safety budget. Any improvements that the community would like to implement would need to be funded by other sources. He advised that people need to take responsibility for their own safety and gave the following advice:

Carry a decent torch

Wear a Hi-vis jacket

Walk towards oncoming traffic, except when approaching bends as visibility is poor for oncoming traffic.

In the event that a car is not slowing down or moving aside, step onto the verge as the driver may not Oaksmere has national speed limit restrictions. The national speed limit is not a target and drivers are advised to drive according to the nature and conditions of the road and its surroundings.
