Foreword from the St Laurence PCC

As I begin, let me first wish you all a Happy New Year; I trust that it will be a happy and joyous one for you. I'm writing this having just watched my youngest daughter in her Christmas concert at Appleton Village Pre-school. It was a wonderful time with the children dressed up and singing songs, arranged in a nativity scene.

Looking at the crib with the baby Jesus sleeping soundly (a testament to the wonderful singing!), I was reminded of the following story:

A girl of ten years went with a group of family and friends to see the Christmas light displays at various locations throughout the city they lived in. At one church, they stopped and got out to look more closely at a beautifully done nativity scene. "Isn't that beautiful?" said the little girl's grandmother. "Look at all the animals, Mary, Joseph and the baby Jesus." "Yes, Grandma," replied the granddaughter. "It is really nice. But there is only one thing that bothers me. And a Message from our Chairman Jane Cranston

It must be New Year!

The request to write the 'From the Chairman' that I'm asked to do early in December always tests me. What will Christmas have brought to the Shop? Will sales have broken a record? Will everybody be feeling up beat and ready for 2020? Will it be warm and wet or cold and sunny?

There's no guessing but what I do know it that the holiday season will have provided the usual trusty band of volunteers to ensure that (ok for shorter hours) the shop remains open for business even as others are in work-free holiday mood.

Our village shop really is a remarkable example of how a community can work together for the benefit of all and, as always at this time of year, a really huge thank you to Staff, Volunteers and Customers alike for the commitment, patience and good humour with which we make our Community Shop one of the best!

Volunteers may have noticed that they've not been invited to a January 'thank you' party. We haven't forgotten you! However, 2020 brings the 20th Anniversary of the foundation of the Community Shop and the Directors have agreed that a bigger and better celebration early in May (ideally on 1st May – the big birthday, but time and date to be confirmed) would be a different and better way to say a big THANK YOU this year.

So, as we head towards completing our twentieth year, thanks and congratulations to

everyone in Appleton - directors past and present, staff past and present, volunteers past and present and ALL customers. We have a great Community Shop, thanks to you all. Let's keep it that way.

HAPPY NEW YEAR and here's to all future directors, staff, volunteers and customers.

Shop Accounts – Year ended 30th April 2019 For those who are interested in the detail, the Shop's financial year ending 30th April 2019 broke records all round.

The turnover, at £271,740 (2018 £251,127) was the highest ever and a post - tax profit of £8,065 (2018 £3,714) was almost the highest ever. (There was one that was double that in 2008 and I've never quite worked out why!) The important figure for villagers to know is the gross profit margin of 24.6% and this is something that villagers should note and be pleased about. A profit margin of under 25% in the food retail world is low indeed and for a small shop it is remarkable.

Should ever prices appear to be high on certain products, it will be because we don't have the purchasing power but certainly not because the margin is too high. Across the board, we are able to work on the minimum sensible margins and can continue to do this for the foreseeable future due to overheads being kept to a minimum ($\pounds 58,047 - \ln 2018$)

£55,706). This is thanks to the huge volunteering input together with the careful control of stock levels and costs from the employees. The benefits achieved from this are passed on to the Village in keeping the margins low.
