Dear Friends,

Last Saturday evening, for want of anything better on TV, I started to watch the 2004 disaster movie, *The Day after Tomorrow*. Disaster movies are not really my genre, and this particular film predictably failed to hold my attention much beyond the scene in which New York is swamped by a 70m high tsunami. The giant wave is caused by a super-storm, itself the result of global warming (of course); and, according to the meteorologists in the film, the super-storm threatens to engulf the entire globe and plunge the world into a new Ice Age.\*

Anyway, this American-produced film got me thinking about that most British of conversation-topics, the weather - especially given the time of year. An old superstition has it that, weather-wise, March comes in like a lion and goes out like a lamb, or else comes in like a lamb and goes out like a lion; that is, the weather will either be fierce / raging at the start of the month and then gentle / fair at the end, or vice versa. The extent to which Oxfordshire's weather obeys the rule this year remains to be seen - though by the time you sit down to read this month's Advertiser, you may at least know how March 2018 "came in."

Disaster movies aside, real-life extremes of weather (tsunamis, cyclones, droughts etc.) obviously pose a problem for people of faith; especially for those who follow the biblical line that God is in control of everything. In the Old Testament, there is frequent reference to God's sovereignty over all types of weather, e.g. "He makes clouds rise from the ends of the earth; he sends lightning with the rain and brings out the wind from his storehouses," (Psalm 135, verse 7). When, in the New Testament, we read that Jesus of Nazareth calmed a storm on Lake Galilee, we are supposed to draw the obvious conclusion - or at the very least, like the disciples who were there at the time, ask ourselves the obvious question: "Who is this? Even the wind and the waves obey him!" (Mark 4, verse 41).

A brief survey of scriptural imagery reveals that **all** types of weather are, in fact, intended as daily pointers to the power and love of God the Trinity: rain symbolises his life-giving words in the Bible; the wind recalls the Spirit's power; the clouds remind us of God's heavenly glory; storms, lightning and hail are pictures of his wrath; and every time the sun shines on us, we should remember his loving smile. Finally, and with forecasters predicting that the UK is about to be hit with another icy blast (from the Russian Arctic), any white stuff should again make us thankful for Jesus' death on the first Good Friday: "Wash me," wrote King David in Psalm 51, (about a thousand years before Christ), "and I shall be whiter than snow."

February's Gardening Club lecture was something of a departure from our usual content. On a rather chilly and wet night, Mark Lord, a professional photographer, gave us an inspiring 'Introduction to creative garden photography'. After taking us (for the benefit of those who don't just point and shoot) quickly through the effects of choosing different aperture, shutter speed and ISO, he moved on to elements of composition: creating leading lines into the photo; framing the image; including points of interest (such as sculptures, dramatic plants, or even gardeners); and ensuring there is foreground interest (be prepared to crouch down to get it, if necessary). He also introduced us to the 'rule of thirds' – Google it, if you're interested! Rather surprisingly, he advised that, for garden photos, it was often best to position the sun behind the subject, whilst blocking the direct view of the sun in order to avoid flare. So we can doubtless look forward to an improvement in the standard of the Village Show's Photography exhibits this coming September!

The Club usually has one natural history topic in the winter lecture schedule, and for March's lecture Ashley Grove will speak on 'A beginner's guide to birdwatching'. The meeting will be on **Wednesday 14th March at 7.30 pm** in Appleton School Hall. Guests are very welcome at £2 a head.

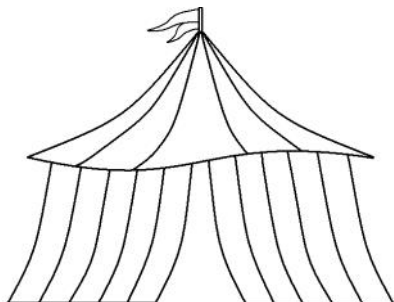

## Appleton School Pupils Join in the 200th Birthday of the Bells

Pupils at Appleton school have been learning all about the history of Appleton Bells this term, in preparation for the big celebration on 4th March.

At a special school assembly, they heard about the heritage of Appleton bells and Whites bell hangers. They tried out hand bell ringing, which they really enjoyed.

Some of the older children will be performing on hand bells at the Bells Celebration itself.

Year 6 (the class at the top of the school) enjoyed a fascinating visit to the bell hanging workshop, where they learned how bells were cast and placed in bell towers. The pupils also learned about the largest bell in the world which is in the Kremlin and weighs 200 tonnes!

The oldest bell the team at Whites have worked on is about 800 years old.

The children heard that the workshops were originally in the Greyhound Pub at Besslesleigh before they moved to Appleton. Amy Carnell, Head teacher said:

' I am delighted that the children at Appleton School have had this opportunity to be involved in the Birthday of the Bells, and I would like to thank all those at Whites and the Appleton Ringers who have helped our pupils learn about such a special part of their heritage.'

## **Dog fouling in the village**

Dog fouling is still a problem in Town Furlong. Environmental Health has been contacted and there will be a leaflet drop around the area as well as signs erected on the verges of Town Furlong.

The dog fouling problem in Long Close and at the bottom of Park Lane is still ongoing and this is causing distress to residents who have to pick up dog mess on their verges and to parishioners who are unlucky to tread in dog mess when trying to enjoy the outdoors.

Although the parish council has received complaints regarding Park Lane and Town Furlong, it is not only these areas that are covered in dog mess. Dog mess can be found on most grassy bits throughout Appleton.

The council would like to remind dog owners of the health and environmental hazards of leaving your dog's mess, bagged or otherwise, for others to find. Dog mess, as well as being unsightly and smelly can cause illness and spread disease. It is a crime for your dog to foul in an area and not clear it up appropriately. The council asks that you clean up properly after your dog and if you have bagged up your dog's mess then please take it home or place it in one of the bins provided. Do not under any circumstances leave bagged mess in the hedgerow. This is just as much a health hazard and crime and causes problems for those maintaining hedgerows.

If anyone witnesses a dog walker committing this offence please note the date, time, details of the dog and the walker and report it to Environmental Health: 01235 422403/

## **Safety in Park Lane**

Park Lane is a busy single track road that is a highway and should be treated as any normal road in Appleton. Please can dogs be kept on the lead when walking down Park Lane, this is for the safety of the dogs and the stress levels of those who drive along Park Lane. This may also prevent the dog fouling problem in Park Lane as it is difficult to keep tabs on your dog when it runs ahead of you.
