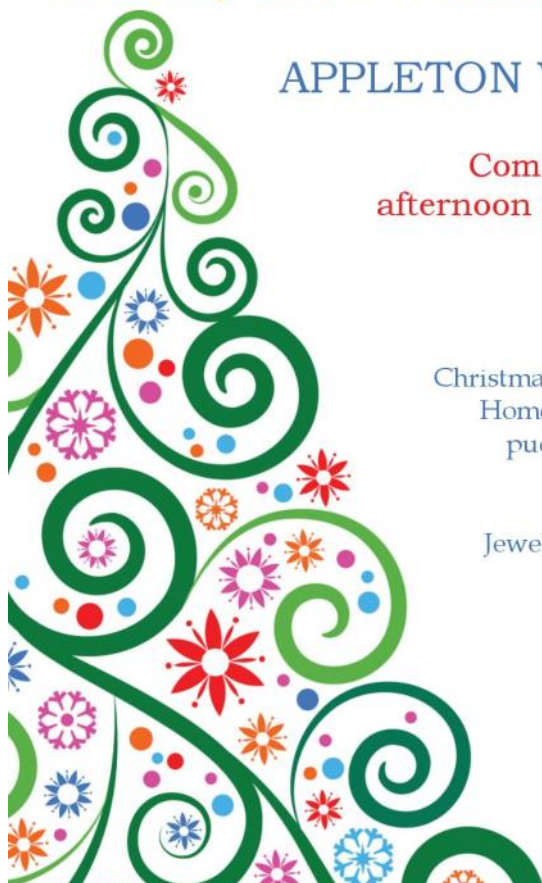

Your local Citizens Advice is launching its annual initiative to help people in financial need who find it hard to pay their energy bills.

The project, called the Energy Advice Programme (EAP), is going live throughout Oxfordshire South and Vale from October to March 2020. It includes comprehensive steps to help people who have to spend a significant proportion of their income on fuel bills.

At an EAP appointment our advisers, depending on your particular problem, can do one or more of the following:

- Help you understand energy companies' tariffs and bills.
- Provide information and support on switching tariff or supplier, identifying any savings you might make.
- Give advice on energy efficiency measures and list any grants available to pay for these.
- Carry out benefit entitlement checks and help you claim any benefits to which you might be entitled. We can help you apply for the Warm Home Discount and the Priority Services Register, if applicable.
- Assist with any customer service complaints you might have against your energy company.

Martin is a National Arboretum volunteer and his talk was about the many and varied trees which grow in the arboretum. The oldest trees were planted by the original owners and in fact the original layout is still maintained with its main rides and long vistas. The arboretum has 139 Champion Trees as well as 5 National Tree Collections. In addition, they undertake research work which includes growing trees which are endangered in the wild with a view to replanting if they become extinct in their original habitats. Martin encouraged us to visit the Arboretum in May when the rhododendrons and camellias are at their best. Westonbirt is of course famous for its Autumn Colour but that is when the majority of visitors are there.

November's lecture is on 13th November by Pauline Pears on Saving Seeds, Saving Money. She is a founder member of Ryton Organic and she will be talking about saving your own seeds and will be sharing some of hers with us. The talk will be at 7.30 pm in Appleton Primary School Hall. It was thoroughly and vastly enjoyable. My son and son-in-law met me after a bumpy landing— not my responsibility! I'm pleased to say all you great and compassionate folk of the Vale and West Oxfordshire raised £16,250 (without gift aid) for the charity.

Notes from our MP, Layla Moran

Following MP Layla Moran's surgery in Appleton in July, she has been in touch with the Parish Council with the following updates.

She has been in contact with Stagecoach about Appleton's bus connections. She is hoping that some buses that travel nearby can get re-routed to go through Appleton itself, given that the Oxfordshire Comet is not enough for the needs of local residents. She is currently waiting for a reply on this.

She has written to Oxfordshire County Council about the speed of traffic outside Appleton school. She has asked them what can be done to slow the speed of passing cars, and whether a zebra crossing could be put in to help the students there.

She has written to the member of the County Council responsible for thinking about re-opening the footpath down to the lock, and asked them to look at Appleton with Eaton Parish Council's application to re-open the footpath as quickly as they can. They have confirmed that this is being prioritized so that it appears in the next year's program of work.
