ULTIMATE SOLDIER

While nobody in our family would ever claim to be a history buff, this year's summer holiday to Northern France again brought us to a site of great historical significance, namely, the *Clairière de l'Armistice*. It was in this forest clearing, shortly after 5 a.m. on 11th November 1918, that the Armistice was signed in the private railway carriage of Marshal Foch. Six hours later, after 52 brutal months and with millions of casualties on both sides, WWI hostilities finally came to an end – at the eleventh hour on the eleventh day of the eleventh month.

Like many communities up and down the country, our villages are preparing to mark the centenary of that event. In the week prior to Remembrance Sunday, for example, each of the pupils at Appleton School will be painting a pebble either red or black; on the Friday afternoon, these pebbles will be laid out in the shape of a poppy in front of St Laurence Church. The "installation" will only be in situ until the morning of Monday 12th, so do take a moment to view it at some point over the weekend.

As for Remembrance Day itself: the traditional church service will begin slightly earlier than usual, at 9.45 am, to be followed by an Act of Remembrance at the War Memorial. At just after 11 o'clock, refreshments will be served in the Village Hall, where the Community Choir will be performing songs from World War I. At the time of going to press, it is also hoped that the Appleton-with-Eaton History Group will be mounting a relevant historical display. We will be joined for the whole morning by around twenty soldiers from Dalton Barracks, to whom we hope to offer a warm welcome: it will no doubt be a poignant and difficult day for many of them, as they especially remember and honour those fellow soldiers and friends who have been injured, traumatised or killed in combat.

Finally, on the subject of sacrifice in warfare, I would just like to draw attention to some striking words from the Bible, which give something of a military perspective on the life and mission of Jesus: *"Since the children have flesh and blood, he too shared in their humanity so that by his death he might break the power of him who holds the power of death – that is, the devil – and free those who all their lives were held in slavery by their fear of death." That is: the baby born in a Bethlehem stable came into the world to <i>fight* - and to fight to the death on our behalf. Like a brave soldier venturing behind enemy lines, the Son of God entered into occupied territory to liberate people from oppression. He knew very well, when he left the comfort and security of his heavenly quarters, that this rescue operation (codename: Crossfire) would require the ultimate sacrifice on his part. But like the best of soldiers, he followed his orders to the letter, laying down his life for others. Now, with the power of the tyrant broken *by his death,* freedom, hope and a glorious future are all within the grasp of once-helpless captives like us.



Appleton Community Shop Accounts Financial Year ended 30th April 2019

Readers with a good memory will recall that for the year ended 30th April 2017 ACSL posted a loss.

On a turnover of $\pounds 240,423$ there was a net loss of $\pounds 4,547$. The reasons were given at the time and were largely associated with a change in

Depreciation policy and costs relating to the refurbishment of the shop.

That is all behind us and for the financial year ended 30th April 2018 the Board are pleased to report that on a turnover of £251,127 the accounts show a net (post tax) profit of £3,714. Turnover was up by £10,700. £3,000 of the increase was related to the few days we were closed for refurbishment the previous year, some of it due to food inflation but most of it due to a steady rise in business since December 2017 (and of course the snow days!). The Gross profit margin was down by 1% due to the decision to hold prices on some items where cost prices went up and also to slightly increased 'wastage' as the shop is now holding an increased range of fresh items which need to be reduced in price if not sold by their 'sell by' date.

Having incurred exceptional items in 2016/17 overheads are down this year and all appears to be well and on an even keel.

The Directors would like to thank the Management for running a tight ship and of course to all our wonderful volunteers without whom the Shop would not and could not operate probably at all and most certainly would not be able to be open for a remarkable 69 hours a week (72 in the summer!)

THANK you all for your support - from the Board of Directors.



News of the Excavation

For two weeks in September, the Appleton Area Archaeological Research Project (AAARP) ran an archaeological excavation in Broadmoor field, with the kind permission and support of the Dick family. AAARP, alongside the AwE History Society and other local people, has been investigating the fascinating past of the village area for a couple of years but this was the first major excavation. The two trenches were positioned to explore ditches, gullies and pits that were revealed in geophysical survey (a kind of ground x-ray). The results were very exciting, uncovering parts of an Iron Age (2000-2500 years ago) farming settlement with houses, field and garden boundary ditches, and pits. The soil was so acid that metal items and bone only occasionally survived, but a great deal of pottery was found and a lovely Iron Age weaving comb.

In one trench, local and other volunteer excavators found the remains of a round Iron Age house and field boundary ditches, including one Roman ditch. The other trench discovered a very wide and deep ditch, again from the Iron Age, that probably surrounded the whole settlement - the farm houses, their gardens and animal enclosures. Many large sherds of pottery, evidence for smithing, and bone came from this ditch. The site – verv early Appleton – had obviously been lived on for many generations in the Iron Age and used into the Roman period. There is a great deal more to find out and there will be further excavation next year from 25 July - 9 August 2019. Come and dig with us then!

The next round of mini-excavations, or test pits, will be dug on 17-18 November in Appleton. Do join us or come and visit. There will be posters up in the village. Make a beautiful wreath to decorate your door. Wine, canapés and a short talk about the first Christmas.
