Dear Friends,

I studied (or at least read and waffled on about!) the poetry of John Keats for my A' Level English course many moons - and, indeed, many autumns - ago. Of the hundreds of memorised quotations from that period of my life, very few remain embedded (or at least accessible) in my mind; though for some reason, at the merest hint of an early-morning September mist, the opening line of "To Autumn" is an exception. Reading the whole poem today for the first time in over 30 years, I found it resonated with me much more than in my youth. No doubt my focus on exam-success back then somewhat undermined my joy in poetry, as well as (ironically) my ability to appreciate the richness of our set texts; but I suspect also that living now in Appleton has "sensitised" me more fully to the natural beauty which so attracted and inspired the Romantic poets. We are very blessed...

By the time this Advertiser goes to press, my family and I will have been resident in Appleton for a full 12 months: we moved into the Rectory at the end of September last year, and the 6th October marks the first anniversary of my licensing as Priest-in-Charge. As that date approaches, I want publicly to thank God for all of you and for your kindness to us over the past year. I especially want to give thanks, in this Harvest season, for encouraging signs of spiritual growth and spiritual "fruitfulness," evident not only in the congregations at St Laurence but also in members of our Christianity Explored courses.

Finally, a much more significant anniversary is also on the horizon. On 31st October 1517, a German monk, named Martin Luther, famously nailed to (or, at least, hung on) the door of Wittenberg Castle Church his "Ninety-Five Theses" – a list of provocative religious questions and statements which led not only to Luther's condemnation as a heretic but also, in time, to the Reformation of the medieval church and a radical re-shaping of Europe. To mark the 500th anniversary of Luther's actions, St Laurence Church will be screening the film "Luther: Rebel, Genius, Liberator" at 3.00 pm on Sunday 29th October. Containing one or two scenes of a sexual nature and some "moderate grisly images" (!), the film comes with a 12 certificate; so anyone aged 12 – 112 would be very welcome. Tickets will be available on the door for £2, with free entry for the over-95s...

Appleton willow made into “The Appleton Bat”

When the Gow farming family approached Appleton Cricket Club vice president and long-term club supporter, Graham Rose, in 2015 with the idea that one of their felled willow trees might be made into a bat for the club, he was very enthusiastic.

Now the bat has been formed from the willow and was presented to Appleton Cricket Club captain, Elliott Bennett, by the Gow family via the club President, Andrew Hammond at the annual President's match in September.

Club chairman Roger Gilkes commented: “We are thrilled to have this bat and thought long and hard what to do with it. On the one hand should we have a presentation cabinet and put the bat in the pavilion, the bat never having been used? Or, on the other, should it be presented to the best batter of the year? The compromise has been that we will invite the club captain to use the bat for a short time during the President's match each year and then put it in a cabinet.”

The club has asked Appleton wood craftsman, Nick Hester, to make the cabinet using Appleton oak.

Cathie Little (nee Gow) said: “It struck me that when we were having some willow trees felled about two years ago, why not make a bat? I am delighted that the Appleton Cricket Club will treasure a very locally made bat!”



Message from the Lock Access Group

The community will be aware that the Lock Access Group (LAG) have been meeting regularly, since November 2016, with the aim of progressing negotiations over access to the river via Lock Lane. It has always been our remit to negotiate a way forward that works both for A H Cornish and the Appleton with Eaton Parish, and respects the private nature of the road way.

Consultation with the community indicated that many people felt that the permit system was not workable in its present format. There was a general sense of the system being unfair in requiring members of the Appleton community to hold a permit, whilst those who come from across the river are not aware of the permit system until they reach the top of Lock Lane. The cost of the permit system was also deemed prohibitive for many members of our community.

Despite strenuous efforts, the LAG has been unable to negotiate a resolution that is acceptable to A H Cornish and also meets the needs of the community. Regrettably, we feel that we have no choice but to disband. We informed the Parish Council of this decision at their September meeting, and a copy of our statement is available on the village website and the noticeboard outside of the shop.
