Letter to an Unknown Soldier: Seize The Day.

Dear Friends,

This month, I thought I would simply share with you a piece of writing, which was sent to me recently by an Appleton resident "in case it is of any use to you, as Remembrance Sunday will soon be upon us." I am grateful for it and have reproduced it in full, respecting the author's wish for anonymity.

Yours, Revd. Ken

You faked your age. What were you thinking of? Did you think it would be just like playing your imaginary game of soldiers when you were a child; when you pretended to fall to the ground to die; to live another day; to play the game all over again? No, I don't think you did.

Were you swept up in the excitement and thrill of the game that was about to become reality that, in your imaginings posed no threat, no fear, no suffering, no cold, no hunger, but only sheer, unadulterated washbuckling fun? No, I don't think you did.

Was it pride that caused you to take up arms? You were so proud to be who you were. You were proud of your country. Yes I think so. You wanted to do your bit. You went to war to help to make all our lives better. You made a sacrifice. You felt the call, 'For King and Country.' Your country needed you and you especially. You were special. You wanted to make a difference, yet Youth forgot to warn you that Death lay in waiting, lurking around each corner turned. You forgot that the long cord of life could instantly be cut; torn to shreds. Man doesn't live forever.

Like us, you didn't want to admit that Death eventually becomes us all when we reach the tip of the aging iceberg. You also knew that death could happen anytime to anyone but you were too young to take heed. You were convinced that you would return to the bosom of your family whenever that may be, to live to tell another tale.

We, the future, know that you only needed to survive for four years. Then, time stretched eternal in front of you unknowing but your commitment was rock solid. Time was of no consequence. But when you were least expecting it, Death pointed its spiky, black finger at you and said: 'It's your turn now. Sadly it can't wait another moment. I know you are embracing life but there's no time to bid farewell, not even to those whom you love the most. You can't even spin the Wheel of Death to choose the least painful way of its happening.

Negotiations are not possible. So! Don't go down that route. Sorry!'

You must surely have known that. Again, the innocence of youth dims the cruelty of death. Yet you and countless thousands of you, who will never live to see the light of day again, nor see life flourish, have granted us the bliss of life. You stood firm in the frightening face of the enemy, firm in the belief that you had to make a sacrifice so that others may live. You felt it was your duty to do whatever it took to bring forth peace. You took the weight of the world's problems on your shoulders. You did your duty.

We cannot thank you enough yet we are unable to get our words to you to show our gratitude. If you had a wish, I guess it would be in the form of a message to the world: 'Please let dialogue in when conflict occurs. Put an end to the slaughter of life, of youthful decay and misery for others. Don't ever seek to glorify war. Somebody out there! Are you listening?'

We became ever more closely acquainted with the Co-Op in Botley as we descended on them at 7.30 in the morning to clear their shelves of milk. They were, as always with us, helpful and patient and the question 'Still not sorted your milk supplier?' was asked with concern for us rather than 'Oops they're nicking all our milk! Visiting the Co-op twice a week and a delivery from Ocado on Wednesdays saw us through for five weeks and we'd like to thank customers for your patience and our volunteers for dealing with the chaos. Particular thanks go to Wanda Todd who spend hours (and we mean hours) finding a new source. She has now found the very excellent Arla, a farmer-owned co-operative in the Midlands who deliver to us three times a week. Our milk sales have gone up and the delivery time is later in the day, so our apologies to those who came in early the other Wednesday and had to go without milk for their cereal. We'll get the quantities right although are getting a bit nervous that we might need more fridge space! Keep buying the Arla products, the milk is good, you're buying British and you're helping to support UK farmers!
