## **CLEAN NEW WORLD?**

I am not really sure how many personality traits I share with President Trump (family-members and close friends might have an opinion on that), but I do admit to having at least **one** thing in common with him. Like “The Donald,” I am something of a germaphobe. For example, I find it very reassuring that most pump-action soap dispensers and multi-surface cleaners can kill 99.9% of all known bacteria; while those handy little bottles of anti-bac gel, which - to borrow from a much older ad-campaign - can be used *any time, any place, any where*, are in my view one of the best innovations since sliced bread. Not least because the gel enables me to actually *eat* sliced bread (and crisps, biscuits, cakes etc.) any time, any place, any where – even when I’m miles from the nearest tap. Genius!

However, despite the vast array of hygiene-related products now available on the supermarket shelves, being germaphobic still has its challenges, especially when eating out or staying away from home. Apart from anything else, *liking* everything to be super-clean often means being disappointed and / or taking steps to *make* everything super-clean. Our recent holiday in France began with two nights accommodation in two different Airbnbs (always something of a risk, especially on a budget), followed by 8 days in a Eurocamp “mobile home.” Actually, because of a booking issue, we ended up staying in two different mobile homes on the same camp-site, which meant double the usual cleaning-load on both entry and exit; sad to report, the second caravan in particular will not be getting a high cleanliness-rating on the Campbell Family’s Customer Satisfaction Survey!

On our return to England this week, Sallie and I spent a day getting our house in Headington ready for new tenants. This was a grimy business, as the previous family needed to move out in a hurry - nothing sinister, just bad planning on their part - and had clearly not had time to clean the toilets, sinks, plug-holes or skirting boards etc; while investigating and dealing with the cooker (down-the-sides, behind, and on the floor underneath) was, for a germaphobe like me, the stuff of nightmares. Some of you will perhaps sympathise with (or even share) my obsessive tendencies on the germs and dirt front; like me, you may even be tempted to justify them with the pious-sounding old saying that “cleanliness is next to godliness.” Others of you, my wife included, might favour the laid-back approach of the so-called Hygiene Hypothesis, i.e. that a little dirt is actually good for you and can help to build a healthy immune system. While it is not easy for me to swallow(!), I have to admit that the Lord Jesus himself would probably have backed this more relaxed view, and have challenged those of us with a tendency to “spray first and ask questions later.” Certainly reading Mark’s gospel (see chapter 7, verses 1-23), we find Jesus telling some of his contemporaries in no uncertain terms to stop obsessing over *external* cleanliness and pay greater attention to the things *inside* them, in their hearts, which make a person “unclean” in a different and more dangerous sense. Obviously, I’d love to elaborate on how the Lord Jesus not only identifies the problem of deep-down “spiritual dirt,” but also offers an effective (and free) solution to it. But it’s dinner-time in the Campbell household, and I need to go wash my hands, and spray the kitchen table...

## Flood Protection in Appleton and Eaton

With the risk of flash floods anywhere after this prolonged hot dry spell, this is a reminder that the village keeps the following equipment available for use in an emergency.

Four pumps, two petrol driven, two electrical, three 100m reels of hose, one aqua vac for shallow surface water on carpets. These are all stored in the centre of the village. There is also a reserve supply of Aquasacs in addition to those distributed to households affected in 2007. These are dry storage sacs which swell when in contact with water, forming an effective barrier. Newcomers to the village who are aware of previous flood risk to their property are advised to check they have their own supply of sacs. If anyone needs a pack please get in touch with Sanchia Prickett and this can be arranged. They are free of charge, take up very little room and only require a dry shelf area.

A group of villagers has volunteered to help out as wardens in an emergency. Each knows how to access and operate the pumps, and can be contacted by telephone. This list is also on the village notice board and web site. Further details are on display on the Parish Council notice board.
