Dear Friends

I'm not a political animal and don't get that excited by politics as a rule, but even I'm conscious that we have a local elections looming on Thursday 6th May. There are times when I despair of knowing who to support, as they all seem to stand for many of the same things and it's so hard to tell them apart. Someone has gone as far as to say, 'Capitalism is man's exploitation of man, whereas socialism is the exact opposite.'

However, one thing I do know is that we are very fortunate to live in a country that practices representative democracy, with elections we can trust, and on the basis of one-person, one-vote. My reason for this rests on two beliefs that Christians hold:

The first is the awareness that government of the people, by the people, for the people, in an open community system that in principle allows anyone to qualify for office, best expresses in political terms our God-given dignity and the worth of each individual.

The second is the perception that power must be limited. In this fallen world, as Lord Acton put it, all power corrupts and absolute power corrupts absolutely. Thus, the separation of powers and the building of checks and balances into executive structures will limit the danger of corruption, even if such procedures for restraint will never eliminate them entirely.

These two Christian insights mesh with the worldly wisdom that sees that the more citizens can feel they have shared in making the decisions that now shape their lives, the more resolutely they will adhere to them.

Here at St Laurence we will soon be holding our annual elections of those who help me to lead the church – both new Churchwardens and a new Parochial Church Council. My thanks to all those who have served the church family these last challenging months and particularly to those who have taken on a responsibility of some sort for the year ahead. I am most grateful to them all, and especially to our Churchwardens, Pete Day (in-coming), Stuart Gibson (out-going) and Roger Mitty (continuing).

Gardening Club



We had an interesting talk by Katherine Crouch on Plants which should be Better Known. Katherine started her talk by describing the changes over the years to the way we acquire plants – starting from nurseries and neighbours through to the garden centres of today. growing mainly from seed or cuttings, bare rooted shrubs to mostly potted up plants. If we go today to independent nurseries we can often find interesting plants as well as unusual varieties of well-known common plants. Katherine talked about the different ways we can grow plants, for instance, against a dark or evergreen hedge to highlight pale foliage, or growing dwarf alpine plants in troughs or pots so that they can be sited anywhere in the garden to be viewed at best advantage.

Joint Local Plan 2041: Call for Sites

Supporting its new Local Plan process, Vale of White District Council held a 'Call for sites' consultation in April to May 2020. Please be aware the Call for Sites is purely a data gathering exercise. It allows landowners, agents, developers, community groups and others who are interested in having land considered for a range of different uses to submit site information to the council that they would like to be assessed. Sites submitted for consideration have been set out in a Call for Sites Register. The site register and maps are published for information and have no status in planning. They can be found on the Vale of White Horse District Council's website.

The Call for Sites does not grant planning permission to any sites submitted or confirm that the sites are suitable for development.

The sites submitted in the 2020 Call for Sites are one source of information that the council will use to consider which sites might be suitable for allocation through the Local Plan. Other potential sites and sources also need to be considered, including those sites submitted previously to the Local Plan 2031 Part 1 and Part 2. The document and appendices (which list the sites) can be found on the Vale of White Horse District Council's website. The planning merits of the sites will be considered using the criteria and method consistent with relevant government guidance, the outcome of which will be published in a Housing and Economic Land Availability Assessment (HELAA). The HELAA is in preparation and will be published alongside future local plan consultations.

Please note: the register has been published in April 2021 and is up to date as of this month. The council may periodically update the content of the register.
