Dear Friends

²⁰"This is what the Lord says: 'If you can break my covenant with the day and my covenant with the night, so that day and night no longer come at their appointed time, ²¹ then my covenant with David my servant—and my covenant with the Levites who are priests ministering before me—can be broken and David will no longer have a descendant to reign on his throne." (Jeremiah 33:20-21)

When your head hits the pillow this evening, what thoughts will go through your mind?

With all the uncertainty that Covid brings, there's much that might concern us. When will I be able to see loved ones again? What side effects might I experience from the vaccine? Will I be able to get away on a summer holiday? And as we approach the summer, there may be a whole host of other questions that niggle away at us while we get to sleep.

However, one question that will *never* trouble us as we go to bed each night is 'will the morning come?' That would be a strange worry indeed! We know with full assurance that day follows night, and we have no reason to doubt that will ever change...which makes the above verses from Jeremiah *totally* remarkable.

When Jeremiah wrote these chapters, the immediate outlook for God's people was bleak. The destruction of Jerusalem was imminent and the exile of God's people to Babylon promised to follow soon after. And yet, in the midst of that the LORD holds out incredible hope.

He draws their attention (v21) to covenants he'd made with David (the promise of an everlasting king) and the Levites (the promise of an everlasting priesthood). And he ties their certainty to the 'covenant' that he's made with the day and the night (v20). That means that even in our sin and weakness, humanity has as much chance of thwarting God's plans as we do of thwarting the unstoppable cycle of day and night. It's hard to imagine a greater level of certainty than that!

And Christian believers today can have even greater confidence. We can see God's faithfulness to David – the Lord Jesus sits on the throne. And we see God's faithfulness to the Levites – they're part of a royal priesthood. And each day across the world, more join their number just as the LORD promises in the next verse:

²² "I will make the descendants of David my servant and the Levites who minister before me as countless as the stars in the sky and as measureless as the sand on the seashore."

There's no doubt that Covid continues to inject life with much uncertainty, both now and into the future. But wonderfully, as our head hits the pillow each night, we can rest in the knowledge that as surely as night follows day the true king of the universe *will* remain on the throne and his kingdom *will* prevail.

Appleton with Eaton History Club

Eaton is off the beaten track. But – until 1960 it was The Beaten Track; a busy short cut from Abingdon to Eynsham via the ferry at Bablock Hythe.

In 1200 AD there was a ferry to connect St Denys' church in Northmoor with Abingdon Abbey. In 1932 a Roman stone altar was dredged from the bed of the ferry; it raises the possibility of a river crossing here in Roman times.

The Devil's Coits – a major Neolithic henge and stone circle - is just two miles west of the crossing. Undoubtedly there would have been traffic across the river to settlements south - such as in the Abingdon area and beyond. Did they use the ferry site?

Whatever - the ferry was washed away in 1959. Before that the hand-operated ferry could carry three cars at a time – plus assorted people and animals. For a time after, The Ferryman Inn set up an occasional ferry for walkers and cyclists. There was a shop servicing the needs of passing travellers on the Eaton side. Also - a red double decker bus that was home to Tommy Knight; he was employed as the road man – keeping the village ditches clear to prevent floods.

St John's college owned much of Eaton and built a row of at least ten substantial chalets along the riverbank upstream of the ferry. These were rented out to college staff and connections; there must have been much fishing, boating, swimming and partying on the river. I have a photograph of the riverside chalets and can send you a copy from my address:


