Dear Friends

"And ultimately, it's my life." Those words were spoken on a recent radio debate about euthanasia. The contributor was seeking to justify his right to choose the time and manner of his death. But the debate could just have easily have been about abortion, or the redefinition of marriage, or a host of other current moral 'hot potatoes', for his statement sums up the philosophy of secular humanism that is coming to dominate our culture. In the absence of faith in God, the only compass left for my choices is my own wants and desires. Indeed the rejection of God is often explicitly commended as the prerequisite for moral and emotional maturity – the ability to stand on my own two feet and make my own decisions. To believe in God is to forfeit my freedom.

Of course, even a moment's thought reveals significant flaws with this creed. For a start it is simply not true. All of us live in a network of relationships that means that I can never act alone without impacting the lives of others. The husband who abandons his wife and children may try to justify his actions with the claims "It's my life", but most onlookers (not to mention his wife and children) would condemn it as utterly selfish. Likewise the teenager who ruins a family holiday by only considering his own wants is rightly regarded as immature. The fact is that humans are fundamentally relational beings, rather than autonomous individuals. In Bible language, we are covenant creatures, born into a web of commitments that ultimately derive their power from the One who made us and therefore owns us.

Which explains why 'it's-my-life-ism' is also an unliveable philosophy. If I try to retain exclusive possession of my life, I will shy away from all relationships that might tie down and make me committed or indebted to others. I will end up lonely, isolated and self-absorbed, which sadly describes the lives of a growing number of people in our culture: they are busy, successful, rich in possessions and experiences, but they have no-one with whom to share these things.

But the ultimate tragedy of this belief in human independence is that it places an unbearable weight on the individual to take sole responsibility for their happiness. My present well-being, not to mention my eternal joy, rests on me and my choices. If I am unhappy, I have no-one to blame by myself and no-one to rescue me but myself. No wonder it's a short step to demanding the 'right to die'.

What a relief, then, for the Christian to hear the words Paul wrote to the church in Corinth: 'You are not your own; you were bought with a price.' By creation I belong to God, but in my sin I have rejected his loving ownership. Yet God loved me so much that he was willing to buy me back as his possession at the infinite cost of his own blood. My eternal security and happiness rest no longer on me and my efforts but on him and his past work of redemption. To the ears of those who place independence above all else, this language of belonging sounds like slavery but, as the Christian discovers, it is perfect freedom. It is only as more see through the lies of our culture, that they will discover the joy and security that comes from belonging to Christ.

Tribute to John Coombs

John was born in 1929 in Brixton, South London the son of an East End tailor and ballet school pianist. Leaving school at 15 years old he spent the next 15 years working as a clerk at Boosey and Hawkes, a leading classical music publisher.

During his national service he became a trumpet and bugle player. John's mother recognised his talent for singing, and without any formal training encouraged him to audition leading to him being successfully recruited by the BBC singers: where he spent the next 15 years as a full time tenor singer, performing countless times on the BBC morning services, travelling Europe, performing and appearing in many TV and radio shows. In addition to this he performed many times at the Proms including Last Nights. He performed in operas at Covent Garden and the Colliseum. In his twenties he composed his own opera 'Valpone' which was performed in 1957, the same year that he met his dear wife Sheila, who was the daughter of the Conductor and Director of The City Opera Club.

In 1959 their son Nigel was born and in 1963 their daughter Angela. The family moved to Wembley for many happy family years. Sadly Nigel passed away in 1972 afflicted by Muscular Dystrophy, a fate he shared with his Uncle Michael a generation earlier. John encouraged Angela to follow in his performing footsteps which she did, becoming a professional dancer for several years. During his time in Wembley as well as his BBC commitments he also made time to sing weekly in a renowned choir at St James's Church, Sussex Garden. He sang on a Saturday morning in a Wembley synagogue and translated many works from German to English. His talent transcending borders and religions. He became a professional translator his clients regularly including the Prince of Liechtenstein- spending many long hours conversing in German. John enjoyed boats and messing about on the water. He bought a boat and named her Navarino which he kept from 1970 to the present day enjoying both The Grand Union Canal in London, and later the Oxford Canal.

In 1980 when it was almost time for Angela to end her school education John and Sheila began to think about moving away from their lifetime London base to seek out a quieter (Sheila hoped less busy life). Sheila's family had retired to Oxford in the 1960's and they were keen to follow in the same direction to a city with many musical and cultural opportunities.

After much deliberation they chose their cottage in the picturesque village of Appleton where they remained for most of the rest of their lives. John did manage to stay extremely busy, translating many more works, music copying and arranging productions for the BBC. He became the full time organist for Oxford Crematorium where he is quoted to have played for over 10,000 funerals. His duties in the village were also extensive, locking and unlocking the Church every day for two decades, church organist, playing and arranging the music for most services, funerals and weddings for his community. He was also the organist and supporter of Appleton Chapel, one of a team of organists at Wootton, Dry Sandford and Besselsleigh churches.

John's passing will leave many memories and legacies, however, after outliving his dear wife and son by so many years he is sure to be at peace and rest with them now.

News from the Appleton with Eaton Parish Council

Covid-19

As the Council is sure you are all aware, as of the 19th July, England has entered Step 4 of the roadmap out of lockdown. The Parish Council notes that while restrictions have been eased, cases remain high and some local restrictions will remain such as mask wearing in the shop. Footpath between Appleton with Eaton and Northmoor Lock

As you may be aware, the Parish Council has made an application for a Definitive Map Modification Order to allow the crossing of the Thames from Appleton. Unfortunately, while the County Council had favoured this in November 2020, after consultation with the landowners, the County Council has now made the determination not to issue the order.

The Parish Council will be meeting on the 2nd August to discuss the possibility of appealing this decision.

Keeping Paths and Pavements Clear

Thank you for all of your efforts in keeping our paths and pavements clear. There has been an improvement. As a reminder, the council would like to ask residents to please not park on footpaths and pavements. Please also ensure that tradespeople visiting your property behave similarly.

In addition to parking, the council would like to ask residents to ensure paths and pavements are clear from foliage to allow safe passage of people with pushchairs, wheelchairs, walkers, etc.

We very much thank you in advance for your cooperation on this matter to ensure people can enjoy walking safely in the village.

63 Bus Service

The Parish Council has learned that funding for the 63 buses will continue until April 2022, beyond the first year to August 2021 that was originally funded. Whether or not the service continues later into 2022 depends on a number of factors including the number of passengers that use the service.

Bonfires

The Parish Council asks that residents follow the following guidelines set out by the Vale of White Horse District Council with regards to bonfires.

Advice if you're thinking of having a bonfire

COVID-19 update – we're urging people not to light bonfires during the pandemic. This is because breathing in smoke can impair a person's oxygen intake and, with more people remaining at home, lighting a bonfire could cause someone to experience breathing problems.

Please consider doing one of these options instead:

Use our garden waste collection service

Use our bulky house waste collection service

Bag it up and take it to your local waste recycling centre

If all the options above are not possible, please follow this advice:

Out of courtesy, please let your neighbours know before you light a fire

Only burn dry/clean wood and garden waste

Please do not:

Burn damp material

Burn rubbish, such as plastic, foam, paint or rubber

Light the fire using engine oil, methylated spirits or petrol

Light the fire in windy weather

Leave it unattended, even if the fire is just smouldering
