


St Laurence Church CHRISTMAS BAZAAR AND FOOD FAIR Saturday 4th December 2-4pm



Dear Friends

For my gap year travels I was the proud owner of a mini-Primus made of brass and fuelled by paraffin. We are talking the late-70's here! It was a thing of beauty, as well as producing an impressive amount of heat. But it sat unused for many years in its tin as other makes and models stole the limelight for weight and ease of use.

During lock-down and our great sort out of accumulated stuff, its bright red tin came to light. Try as I might, nothing I did got it going! It would flicker encouragingly, only to then die on me. After several attempts I finally admitted defeat. But it taught me a valuable lesson about life. I learnt that trusting the untrustworthy is a heart-breaking exercise. I learnt that faith only ever works when it's placed in something (or someone) that is faithful. And I learnt that careful thought is required when it comes to where you put your faith.

All this has implications for being a Christian because, as you may have noticed, 'faith' seems to play a pretty big role in Christianity. For example, whenever the apostle Paul writes to a church, more often than not, it's their faith he's concerned about. He thanks God for their faith, he prays for their faith, he boasts about their faith and he expresses his desire to safeguard their faith. Indeed, faith is so important that sometimes the Bible uses the word 'faith' as a way of referring to the Christian message itself. So, faith must be a pretty big part of being a Christian.

So, in the new, 6-part series that we're running throughout November, we're going to try and come to a fuller understanding of what Christian faith is all about. We'll be thinking about questions like: What makes faith so crucial? What exactly are we meant to have faith in? What were God's reasons for making our faith so important? What difference should our faith make to everyday life?

It's a topic well worth grappling with because of the importance of faith. A naïve or misplaced faith will only ever lead us into confusion and disappointment. My Primus experience certainly showed me that!

I hope you'll join us for the series at Sunday@10 each week. There's a creche on offer for pre-school children and children's groups for those at Primary School. There's also fresh coffee and home-baked cakes! I look forward to welcoming you.

Foodbank news

Up until now, I have delivered food donations from the collection boxes in the Village Shop to the Community Emergency Foodbank (CEF) which is based at St Francis Church in Hollow Way in Oxford. Between January 2021 -June 2021 it has fed 1,800 people, 700 being children. Despite such high demand for food parcels, food stocks have remained high. So, I'm happy to confirm that from now on any food donated to the boxes in the Village Shop will be delivered to the Abingdon Foodbank, which is based at Christ Church in Northcourt Road, Abingdon. Gardening Club



In October we had an interesting talk given by Alan Down on Winter Colour in the Garden. Alan began his talk by showing us pictures of several Winter Gardens including RHS Rosemoor and Wisley Gardens, Holme Garden Centre, Cambridge Botanical Garden and Sir Harold Hillier's Arboretum. Each of these gardens has an area planted up especially for winter interest with trees with good coloured bark, dogwoods and willows with interesting-coloured stems, conifers, winter flowering trees and shrubs, grasses and winter flowering heathers.

Alan then went on to give us an idea of the kind of plants we could use in our own gardens for winter interest. We could plant up containers with winter flowering pansies and violas or plant hardy cyclamen coum which look particularly good planted in the grass under trees. Another good plant is winter flowering heather carnea which will grow well with conifers, is lime tolerant and offers pollen for bumble and honey bees when there is little else flowering. Good trees for bark include Acer Griseum, Betula utilis Jacquemontii and Eucalyptus niphophylla. Shrubs we could plant include winter Jasmine which is good in a shady corner or on a fence. Garrya elliptica James Roof which has long tassels, Daphne mezereum which flowers from January to March and several Viburnums and Hollies. Leaving seed heads on perennials such as Rudbeckia and not cutting grasses back until the spring can add interest to the borders. Other shrubs for winter interest include Witch Hazels, Pittosporum Tom Thumb, Mahonia, Hazel Contorta and Sarcococca confuse. Mass planting of snowdrops, crocus and hellebores all add colour and pollen for bees tempted out by the rising temperatures.

Our next talk will be given by Jane Perrone on Houseplants. Jane has for several years hosted a podcast on indoor gardening entitled "On the Ledge". Her talk will demonstrate many ways to enjoy and make the best use of houseplants. The talk will be on 10th November at 7.30 pm on Zoom.

Our talks are currently being held on Zoom but we are planning to hold in person talks in the spring. One of the advantages of Zoom is that we have been able to book speakers from further afield and therefore have a wider range of talks. Those of you who take notice of such things will have spotted that turnover in the Shop has dropped somewhat dramatically.

Whilst we always knew that sales would drop back to pre-pandemic figures we are a little surprised that currently we're running at 2018 levels! The drop cannot be allocated to anything in particular but is right across the board - many products, including staples such as milk, bread and eggs have fallen right back.

Can anybody tell us what's going on? Is it that some of you who were not online grocery shoppers before the pandemic now are? Is it that we are being too strict with our covid precautions? Is it that parents are not stopping on their way to and from school? Is it that we're closing at 6pm instead of 7pm? (By the way we don't think it is this as sales were never high at that time). Is it that tradespeople are dropping in less? Is it that not being able to stop and chat means fewer visits to the shop? Is it that we're not baking croissants every day? Is it that? We can tell you that footfall is down by a bigger percentage than turnover and that since May:

- Overall milk sales are 15% below 2019 figures
- Coffee sales are 34% below 2019 figures
- Our delicious freshly sliced local ham sales are 23% below 2019 figures
 Can you tell us – and please do - what you think are the reasons?

We're feeling a little sad. Having raised our game, thanks to our wonderful bank of volunteers and staff, to keep stocked and open during the lock downs, we're now wondering where all our customers have gone?!


