St Laurence's is in an exciting place with a number of new initiatives planned for a growing church family of all ages.



Gardening Club



In November we had an interesting talk given by Jane Perone on House Plants. Jane suggested we become plant detectives by looking at and feeling the foliage to determine what category of plants we have in our houses and to enable us to give them appropriate care. For instance, cacti and succulents store water in the stems and leaves so it is important not to over water. On the other hand. Maidenhair Ferns have thin leaves and often die from lack of water and need to be placed in the shade.

If in doubt check the roots and poke some holes in the soil to see how wet it is or whether the roots are pot bound, as it may need a bigger pot and remember roots need air as well, as water. Keep the plants where you can see them both for pleasure and so that you notice any changes. During the winter cacti and succulents like to be cool and dry.

Jane went on to talk about various interesting plants we could have in our house plant collections, such as Fishtail Hoya, Begonias. Hare's Foot Fern and Oxalis. It is also important to remember that pot plants are often If you live in Appleton, Eaton, Fyfield or toxic, particularly if you have small children or pets. It's recommended that you check your plants regularly for scale insects and remove by hand. To feed your plants weekly when they are in active growth and to flush out salts by giving them a good watering allowing them to drain afterwards.

Ten thousand and forty of Caters Grandsire

St Laurence's tower has a famous ring of 10 bells and people from all over the country come to Appleton for the 4th March celebrations, held on the first Saturday in March, which commemorates the gift of the original ring of six bells by Robert Southby in 1818. The bells were augmented to 8 in 1854 and 10 in 1875. A total of 523 peals have been rung on the bells since 1855 and these have included several record and long length peals.

In 1871, a record peal of 10,080 Grandsire Caters was rung and 50 years later, in 1921, a peal of 10,043 Grandsire Caters was rung to commemorate the record peal of Grandsire Caters. This peal is commemorated in one of the songs sung at the 4th March dinner (ten thousand and forty of Caters Grandsire) which has verses describing the ten ringers who rang in the peal. On 11th December 1971, a further long length of 10,241 changes was rung to commemorate the 50th and 100th anniversaries of the original record peal.

This year (2021) sees the 150th anniversary of the first record peal of Grandsire Caters on the bells and the 50th and 100th anniversaries of the commemorative long length peals rung in 1921 and 1971. On Saturday 11th December, which is 50 years since the last 10.000 of Grandsire Caters was rung, it is planned to attempt another long length peal of Grandsire Caters to commemorate these anniversaries. The peal has been specially composed for the occasion by Simon Bond from Oxford, who called the first half of the proposed peal for our recent halfmuffled peal in memory of the fallen, for Remembrance Weekend on Saturday 13th November. The attempt will start at about 10.00 and is expected to take approximately 6 hours.

A Special Rum

There are many reasons for having rum at Christmas. In Christmas pudding, rum punches and so on. Another is that Appleton has a historic link with one particular rum – made in Jamaica.

The story starts in 1632 with the birth of Francis Dickinson. He was the second son of the Rector of Appleton – William Dickinson. Francis became a soldier and in 1655 was key in the English invasion and capture of Jamaica from the Spanish. It had been Spanish for 150 years. It remained a British colony for 300 years until independence.

Captain Francis Dickinson was rewarded for his role in capturing the island. He was given 6,000 acres of Jamaica. The land became known as the Appleton Estate. It is in the fertile Nassau Valley in the west of Jamaica. It is now a popular tourist attraction centred on the rum distillery – the oldest in Jamaica. The photo shows a bottle – almost empty - of the Signature Blend.

Appleton Estate Rum is highly regarded. It is sold around the world – a lasting testimony to the heroic deeds of a son of Appleton some 370 years ago.
For balance we should say that Francis' older brother – Edward - also achieved fame and fortune as a physician to two Kings – but that's another story.
