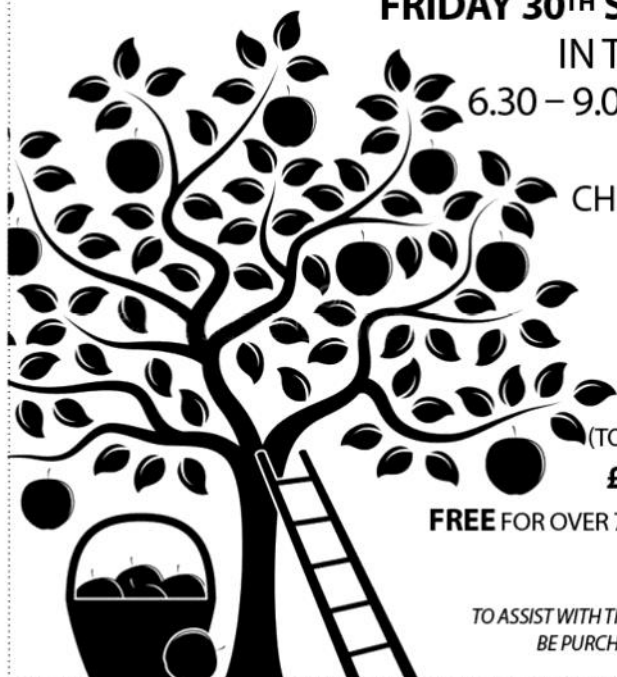

Dear Friends

I hear regularly people tell me that it is impossible to be certain about anything. But, for this claim to be true it must be certain, and so by the same person's logic it cannot be true!

But one thing that you can be sure about is whether or not you are a Christian. Several things assure the believer that he or she is a real Christian.

First, God's promises about forgiving us and receiving us are true and can be relied on. If you have prayed the prayer I included in last month's Foreword and meant it, be in no doubt that you have been heard and answered. Even though you may feel no different, a new life has begun with Jesus as your Lord.

Secondly, our changed attitudes towards God, sin and the world assure us that God has made us new people. When God does this it is forever.

Thirdly, there are times when Christians feel the wonder of God being their Father. St Paul tells us that this is the Holy Spirit bearing witness with our spirit that we are God's children. A person knows that he or she is a Christian because they do not want to sin any more. There is also a new love for people. All these new attitudes are gifts from God.

Christians are not perfect. Although we aim to live with Jesus as our Lord, there will be times when we fail. Failure and sin do not alter our relationship with God – you are still a Christian – you are still a child of God. What distinguishes the Christian response to failure is that we no longer say "it doesn't matter" or try to justify our actions. We recognise that what we have said or done is grievous to God, and as well as seeking to make amends, we regret it and resolve, with God's help not to fall again. But we do long for the day when Jesus will return and then we will be perfect.

Living the Christian life is never a solo activity. We need the help and encouragement of a local church of which we are a regular part. St Laurence aims to provide a home for all who seek to follow Jesus or wish to discover more about what that entails. Our weekly safety checks have revealed cases of vandalism to equipment at Jubilee Park. Both the bucket swing and the new table-tennis table have been damaged.

The Friends of Jubilee Park are very concerned that these criminal acts might continue and we may be forced to take serious action to prevent further instances.

Should the annual ROSPA safety check find that the damage jeopardises the safety of the park it may be necessary to close the park until the equipment is repaired or replaced. This would be a costly procedure - the estimate for the replacement of the bucket swing alone is over £2,000!

We would urge everyone to encourage responsible use of the Park and to report any anti-social behaviour to the Parish Clerk.

Oxford Diocese are partnering with Getting Oxfordshire Online, SOFEA, ASPIRE and Bicester Green to take electronic devices which are no longer required by their owners, wipe them of any personal data and repurpose them and provide them (with data and training) to people who desperately need them. We think it is fantastic project which helps people protect their personal data and provides devices for Ukrainian refugees and others who desperately need them.

Getting Oxfordshire Online has already helped many people who are digitally excluded, including refugees in Oxfordshire, to get online thereby allowing them access to GPs, education, cheaper bills, online food orders etc.

## How can people help?

Do you (or the organisation you work for) have any devices that might be suitable that you would be willing to give to this project? If so please check that they are the sort of device we are looking for:

- Laptops up to 12 years old (High-spec Windows Vista, any Windows 7 or later, and all “unibody” macs)
- Tablets up to 10 years old

- Minor faults (failed disks, broken keyboards, missing chargers etc) can be repaired

# Appleton History – crop marks

About a 100 years ago early pilots noticed unusual and strange marks in the landscape. Marks in the farmer's crops in their fields – of which the farmers usually knew nothing. These became known as “crop marks”.

Since then huge collections of aerial photographs - in visible and infrared light – have been made – many in Oxford and Cambridge. It was soon realised that these crop marks – usually in a grass – marked buried remains. These could range from ancient trackways, iron age villages, Roman dwellings to mediaeval remains.

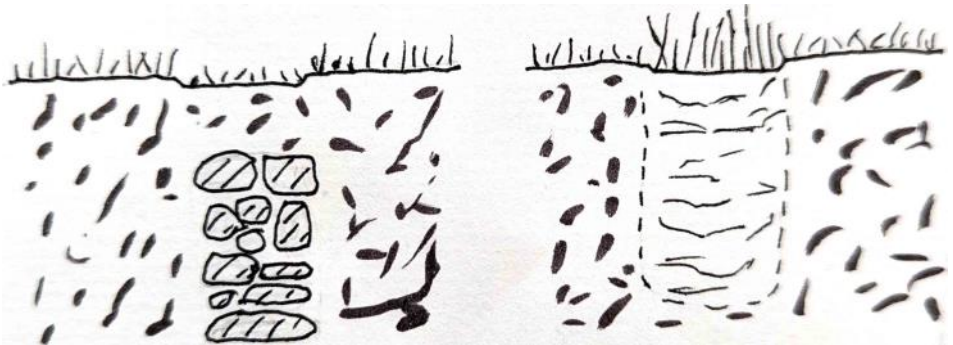
If – for example - there was a long buried wall the crop above it would be stunted – see

sketches; conversely an old ditch might boost crop growth.

The most obvious crop mark in the parish is that of the old Oxford Road. This ran from the Thatched Tavern pub across the fields to Cumnor. Look at an aerial view – Google or Bing – of the houses in Eaton Road. There is a field just beyond the last house in Eaton Road. A dark track line runs across the field – the Oxford Road as was some 200 years ago.

There are many other types of landscape marks. Just beyond the field above – on the current APs - is a long curved brown smudge in the soil. Almost certainly evidence of water draining downhill to the stripling Osse Brook; possibly dating back 10,000 years to the last ice age.
