Dear Friends

Oracle, Arizona, lies 38 miles northeast of Tucson. It's a small, mountain town near where Buffalo Bill Cody once owned mines. Oracle later became famous as the location of Biosphere 2, an experimental structure designed to demonstrate the viability of a self-sustaining closed ecological system for supporting human life in outer space.

Complete with its own rain forest, ocean, grassland, wetland, and desert, Biosphere 2 enabled scientists to experiment with farming and innovation. Findings from this tiny, closed world led to a number of new ideas related to food production, plant growth, recycling of wastewater and air purification.

Biosphere 2 opened to great fanfare in 1991 when the first scientists were sealed in the facility and two years of experimentation began. As with any new endeavour, the scientists ran into unexpected problems and challenges. One of the most mystifying tests came when the trees began falling. Beautiful, majestic trees failed to mature fully within the closed ecosystem and began falling at alarming rates.

The trees toppling were totally unexpected. So what happened? Why would otherwise healthy conifers and palm trees simply collapse? The answer turned out to be simple: the lack of wind in the biosphere. The importance of wind in the development of the plant's life was among the most interesting things the researchers learned during the two-year experiment.

It turns out that physical stress presented by storms and winds is necessary for a tree to become strong. In the wild, wind and the occasional storm keep the tree moving as it grows, causing it to develop something called 'reaction wood' or 'tension wood'. This strong inner wood enables the tree to bend without breaking and survive stressful loads. Reaction wood also helps the tree adapt to its environment, including contorting towards the best light. Strong and stormy winds help the tree grow and thrive, even when bent into awkward shapes.

People are like trees. We need the winds of adversity and the pressure and challenge presented by crisis to sharpen us. Our stormy times and even failures can strengthen our inner beings and cause us to mature and thrive. Unexpected adversity is often painful yet crucial to our success and to developing true resilience.

Energy Price Increases

You may notice some strange goings on in the shop!

We are currently undertaking an exercise to see what options are available to us to reduce our electricity bills. Unless we can find ways of cutting our usage, our energy costs are in danger of rising to £20,000 a year. We are therefore currently checking how much energy each appliance uses.

We would like to give many thanks to James Barrett for several hours of his time spent installing the new energy monitors.

(You may already have noticed that the fruit and vegetable chiller is currently turned off).

When we have checked each appliance, we will know better whether old equipment uses much more electricity than new, whether we are charging enough for hot sausage rolls and pasties, whether we could manage without one of the freezers in the winter months, whether we need the aircon on all the time, or whether solar panels (even on the small amount of roof space we have) would be worth the investment. It feels at the moment that every time we place an order there are price increases coming through and we are very conscious that with the huge rises in food costs, we want to do all we can to keep the increases we have to pass on to a minimum and reducing our energy usage will help us to do just that.

So when you see equipment being turned off, or being used in a different way – don't worry. We're experimenting!

Appleton History – Appleton to Balmoral and beyond.

In about 1915 a young woman from Appleton answered a job advert in The Lady magazine. She wrote a pristine letter of application and sent it off together with two testimonials from people of standing. She got the job – at Balmoral Castle - working in the household of King George and Queen Mary.

For a daughter of Appleton this was a hugely prestigious step-up for the young woman -Norah Stimpson; a step-up that would change the rest of her life.

Norah was born in 1897 the daughter of George and Edith Stimpson. Just two years later a great If you live in Appleton, Eaton, Fyfield or fire destroyed their home – opposite Yew Tree Cottage. Norah spent four years at Balmoral mostly attending one of Queen Victoria's granddaughters. But Norah clearly didn't let the grass grow beneath her feet for she left Balmoral for a new job - in Australia!

Again this was probably secured by postal replies to magazine adverts; applying for a job from Balmoral Castle would have given her great credibility.

Norah spent the next ten years as lady-inwaiting to Dame Nellie Melba – an Australian operatic singer who was a global superstar. Norah would have travelled the world with her from Australia to America, Britain and Europe all by ocean liners.

Dame Nellie's health went downhill – possibly a complication of early plastic surgery; she died in 1931. Norah returned to Britain and worked

looking after gentlefolk on the south coast.

When she retired she came back to Appleton and built a home on the site of her parent's from Appleton to Appleton – via The World. I'm very grateful for the help of Peter Stimpson.
