Dear Friends

"I tell you, now is the time of God's favour, now is the day of salvation"

2 Corinthians 6:2

I can still recall the struggle it was to teach our children to tell the time. If you have children, perhaps you remember the same experience or, indeed, are going through it! Gardening Club



At our AGM in May 2022 members were told that the Committee wished to stand down and the Chairman asked if anyone was willing to come forward to take up the officer posts of chairman, treasurer and secretary or to stand as a member of the committee. The treasurer's post was filled but no one else came forward at that time. The committee agreed to remain in post while we explored other ways of taking the club forward. We explored various suggestions but sadly none of the alternative suggestions proved to be viable. We therefore held an Emergency General Meeting in December to report on the situation and members were asked to vote on the Dissolution of the Club. The motion was put to the members present and was passed by a majority of the those present for the club to be dissolved on 30th April 2023. The club will continue with the rest of the lecture programme until April and we are also organising a visit to RHS Wisley in April.

In January Joe Wainwright talked to us on How to take Better Garden Photos. Joe has always been interested in photography starting with his first camera when he was 8 years old going digital in 2005 and becoming freelance in 2012 when he began specialising in garden photography. He has had photographs published in The English Garden, Garden Illustrated, the RHS Magazine to named but a few.

Joe gave us tips on the importance of light, basic techniques, views, detail planting and features, portrait or landscape, wide angle telephoto lens, shutter speeds, apertures and close ups etc. He then illustrated each point with photos he had taken mostly of gardens in Cheshire. On the importance of light for instance taking photos on a bright but overcast day or very early in the morning or evening produces a much better photo than in bright sunny weather. On composition the rule of thirds with leading lines and framing produces a visually pleasing photo. If you use a manual camera then adjusting the speed or the aperture for a particular subject can produce interesting results. In conclusion Joe spoke about the importance of light, composition, views or detail, landscape or portrait, wide angle and shutter speed.

It was a very interesting talk with tips for everyone depending on whether you use a phone camera or a more sophisticated manual camera.

In February Andrew Mikolojski will talk to us about Shakespeare's Plants and Gardens. Andrew is an experienced garden author and speaker who has recently been a horticultural adviser to a project to revise the RHS Encyclopedia of Plants and Flowers. He has a particular interest in garden history.

The meeting will be held on Wednesday, 8th February at 7.30 pm in Appleton School Hall. Guests are always welcome and there is a small charge of £2 per guest.

As many of you will know there is a group in the village actively seeking to re-establish a Pre school. The main focus of this group is the redesign of the village hall to re purpose the area behind the current stage curtain into a dedicated permanent pre school facility.

We (the committee) have a duty to all sections of our community to act as trustees of the charity in line with our charity commission deed, set up in 1978.

We wish to make it clear to all, that none of us are against the establishment of a pre school within the village, but whether the village hall can provide a viable space without impacting on other village users / activities is another matter.

It has become apparent over the last couple of weeks that the current village hall committee do not have the capacity to deal with this project. We have also, for a number of reasons, reached an impasse with the pre school group amongst whom we feel there is an erroneous perception that we are deliberately obstructing the delivery of this project. This is not true. We have been trying to work in a structured way to ensure the project only moves on to further stages if it passes a viability test.

As it is clear that we are not the group to take this idea forward, none of us will seek re-election at the forthcoming hall AGM in May this year. In the meantime, we will continue to run the hall's day to day activities until the AGM and continue with the improvements programme that is in place. We have given notice to the Parish Council who will now have 4 months to find a new committee that hopefully can be drawn from a broader demographic of the village. So if anyone is interested in becoming a trustee of the hall, or if you have any comments on the situation, then please make yourselves known to the Parish Council.

A GUIDE TO SERVICES AT THE BOTLEY MEDICAL CENTRE AND KENNINGTON SURGERY

The Patients Participation Group is aware of alternative clinicians who are available for consultation other than GPs. Appointments with these clinicians can be booked in advance for non-urgent matters.

Botley Medical Centre is keen to ensure patients are fully aware of the services and appointments available to them.

Appointments can be made with the following clinical staff, subject to availability:

GPs, nurses, health care assistants, midwives, physician's associates, paramedics, first contact physiotherapists, clinical pharmacists, care coordinators, social prescribers, primary care healthcare workers (from Mind) and the Practice is recruiting a mental health practitioner.

Please give the receptionist a brief description of your clinical needs so that they can book you an appointment with the most appropriate clinician. You can call after 1100 hours to book an appointment with a clinician, other than the GPs, for up to four to six weeks in advance.

GP appointments:

- currently, you can only book appointments with a GP on the day by calling early in the day

- you can also book an appointment online to see a GP face to face.

Please request access online at the Practice. Once it is set up, download the PatientAccess app onto your smartphone, tablet or home computer. Please follow a number of steps, including information to identify yourself. When your account is set up, you will be able to login safely and securely. This service can only be used for 'on the day' appointments after 0800 hours and will only offer a slot if one is available that day. Five appointments are kept reserved / day / GP working available. These are often unbooked. Please book an appointment this way if you can. Blood test results can also be seen through the app.

There are also other healthcare services you can book without a GP consultation first. If appropriate, you can refer yourself to the following NHS services in Oxfordshire, without a GP appointment first:

Sign up for low-cost broadband – Citizens Advice tip

Citizens Advice Henley has expressed concern that people in need are not taking advantage of cheap broadband and mobile phone schemes set up specially to help them. Loosely termed "social tariffs" or "essential broadband", these schemes are discounted deals intended for those on Universal Credit, Pension Credit, Employment and Support Allowance, and some other benefits.

Statistics show that only 1.2% of those eligible to register for these low tariffs have done so, although they could save over £100 a year.

Social tariffs are provided in the same way as normal phone and Internet packages, but at a lower price. Network providers liaise with the Department of Work and Pensions (DWP) to ascertain customers' eligibility, and the DWP is required to provide only the necessary information, so that personal information remains safe.

At the time of writing, not all telecom companies offer social tariffs but it is possible for those who qualify to switch to a supplier that does provide them. The usual fees for switching contracts, leaving a contract early or terminating them have in many cases been scrapped for those on benefits who qualify for these tariffs – but check with your supplier to make sure.

Two “Noah’s Arks”

260 years ago an Oxford student spent the day on the Thames near Appleton; fishing, boating and drinking. He also saw a beautiful girl – so beautiful that he fell head over heels in love with her - and determined to marry her.

But there was a huge social divide. The girl was 17-year old Betty Ridge, the daughter of the lockkeeper of Northmoor’s Noah’s Ark weir and he was William Flowers, a 19-year old graduate of Christ Church and Viscount Ashbrook.

Such was William’s determination – and Becky’s love that she spent a year learning to read, write and acquiring the knowledge and skills of a “lady” of the late 1700s. In March 1766 they were married in St Denys parish church in Northmoor. William may have been destined to marry in St Paul’s London – like his parents. William and Betty quickly settled in Shellingford – ten miles away in Berkshire.

I have told this story before. Previously I had described Noah’s Ark weir as being in Appleton - as had Fred Thacker the pre-eminent authority on the history of the Thames. An issue is that there were TWO Noah’s Ark’s on the Thames – just TWO miles apart; one on the north bank in Oxfordshire and one on the south bank in Appleton, Berkshire. The name “Noah’s Ark” was usually given to a remote out of the way place. In this instance both weirs met that description.

About ten years ago the correct account of Betty and William was published by Julie Godson of Northmoor- that of Northmoor’s Noah’s Ark (The Water Gypsy). Appleton’s “Ark” still stands in the private grounds of Cowslip Close at the end of Millway Lane. Northmoor’s “Ark” remains as foundations on an island due west of Eaton.
