

Dear Friends

This year is the 40th anniversary of the Falklands War, fought during the Spring and early Summer of 1982. Two posthumous Victoria Crosses were awarded during that campaign – one to Lt Col 'H' Jones and the other to Sgt Ian McKay, both of the Parachute Regiment.

After a gruelling tab (battle march) all the way across East Falkland, 3 PARA conducted a night assault on an enemy battalion in prepared positions on Mount Longdon. Whilst reconnoitring an enemy position, the Platoon Commander was wounded in the leg and command passed to Sgt McKay. It was clear that instant action was needed if the advance was not to stall with increasing casualties. Sgt McKay decided, therefore, to attack even though he was in no doubt about the strength of the enemy positions and, after quickly gathering a number of men, broke cover and charged. The assault was met with a withering hail of fire with two soldiers wounded and one killed. Sgt McKay, with complete disregard for his safety, continued the charge alone and on reaching an enemy position cleared it with grenades, thereby relieving 4 and 5 Platoons.

His medal citation continues the story:

Sergeant McKay, however, was killed at the moment of victory, his body falling on the bunker. Without doubt Sergeant McKay's action retrieved a most dangerous situation and was instrumental in ensuring the success of the attack. His was a coolly calculated act, the dangers of which must have been all too apparent to him beforehand. Undeterred he performed with outstanding selflessness, perseverance and courage. With a complete disregard for his own safety, he displayed courage and leadership of the highest order, and was an inspiration to all those around him.

I served with the Parachute Regiment between 1997 and 1999 and his name was always spoken with quiet deference and huge respect. We are able to remember him and millions of others who gave their lives in war for our and others' freedom this month on Sunday 13 November. We gather in church at 10am for an All Age Service, with children especially in mind, and then at the War Memorial at 10.45am. Please do join us.

Whenever I think of Sgt McKay, I am reminded of Jesus' sacrificial death. Deliberate and with us in view, effective in making possible freedom from the penalty that our attitude to God deserves, and a demonstration of God's love for each one of us.

Stamps are changing

Alternatively old stamps can be used up to the end of January 2023.

All stamps can still be used for Christmas posting. Special/picture stamps are not changing and can still be used after January 2023

Gardening Club



We had a very interesting talk in October given by Val Bourne called "The Living Jigsaw" which was based on a book she wrote on the wildlife in her garden, particularly the insects she has found there. Val started her career in nursing, followed by teaching before she moved into vegetable research, after which she returned to teaching and she finally went into radio and writing. She has always gardened organically and while she was working in vegetable research became more aware of the need to keep nature in balance. For instance, if you kill all the slugs and snails with chemicals, you won't attract birds into your garden as they won't have a food source. Insects need plants to feed on as well as to lay their eggs which in turn need plants to

feed. Using chemicals destroys the food chain.

Val's 1/3 of an acre garden in the Cotswolds is south facing but cold due to the elevation. She took us through the seasons from the spring garden to the winter garden showing pictures of the insects who have a home in the garden. By densely planting, helping to maintain moisture and keeping down the weeds, the garden is full of colour throughout the year. Included in the garden are wild areas which allow mammals like hedgehogs to find a home as well as allowing orchids and brown butterflies to flourish. Where the roses or paeonies are growing, they are surrounded by daisy type open flowers which give plenty of food for pollinators. Val gave us many ideas which we can use in our own gardens.

At the end of the talk Val's book "The Living Jigsaw" was available to purchase.

Our November talk will be given by Michael Holland on "Five Plants that Changed the World". Michael is an ecologist, educator and author whose mission is to explain to us all the vital role that plants play in our daily lives. He spent 17 years as Head of Education at the Chelsea Physic Garden. The meeting will start at 7.30 pm and will be held on Zoom and is free of charge. 
