### **Dear Friends**

I've had numerous conversations over the past few weeks about my move from Appleton this summer. Many were over the Coronation Weekend at all the splendid events organised by those working hard behind the scenes. Thank you to all those who played any part in them!

Two questions dominated those conversations: When is my last Sunday and what does the new job involve? Allow me to seek to answer both.

My last Sunday will be 2nd July and I'd like to invite, as many as would like to come, to join us for church that day. We're moving church to 11.00am that morning and following it with a BBQ, to which you are also invited. This will be an opportunity for me to say 'Farewell' and 'Thank you'. I do hope you're able to come.

The military charity I'll be working for, as Ministry Director, is SASRA – the Soldiers and Aviators Scripture Readers' Association. Isabel and I will move locally and, although their HQ is in Aldershot, I'll work mostly from home. Much of my time will be spent visiting the 20 staff who deliver the charity's mission, supporting them and encouraging them.

SASRA has the privilege of working alongside military personnel, taking the opportunity to show how Christian values and ethics support and reinforce the values and standards of the British Army and the Royal Air Force. Jesus Christ's selfless service and ultimate sacrifice have been an inspiration to generations of men and women serving in our Armed Forces, from whom we expect so much. It all started in 1818 when Sgt Rudd, a Non-Commissioned Officer in the Royal Artillery offered the scriptures, biblical literature and his personal witness to his colleagues. His efforts founded the Soldiers' Friend Society, turning into the Army Scripture Readers' Society and merging with the Soldiers' and Airmen's Christian Society in 1938. This ministry was sustained with active ASRs deployed forward to support our soldiers in both World Wars, and in peacetime, across the world in various garrison locations.

Currently, SASRA has Army Scripture Readers deployed in army bases across the UK. All ASRs have previous military experience and are passionate about sharing the gospel of Jesus Christ with the soldiers they work alongside. Throughout the careers of our soldiers, ASRs will offer testimony, exhortation, fellowship and encouragement, whether their soldiers be in basic training, their everyday workplace, on exercise, or in pre-deployment training for overseas tours.

# "Don't tell him, Pike"

Don't panic, don't panic! No, I'm not down at Walmington-on-Sea re-enacting Dad's Army. This month, Esox lucius, the pike, a largely solitary fresh water apex predator that can been found all over Blighty in our rivers, lakes, canals, reservoirs and lochs, often lurking in the vegetation and bursting out with ferocious speed to catch its prey. They mainly feed on other fish but also frogs, small mammals and ducklings with larger fish taking small ducks and moorhens. The territorial pike is a long slender fish, olive green with cream blotches and belly, the dorsal fin set back near to the tail making them quick and powerful. The British record is 46lbs 13ozs, caught in a reservoir in South Wales back in 1992, but larger fish have been found dead, in fact I have a taxidermic specimen that was found dead (mine is just over 36lbs and 43" long.) The name pike comes from the shape of the fish which resembles the medieval pole-like weapon, the pike. Young pike are known as jacks. Females can grow up to five feet in length and live for 25+ years, their jaws full of hundreds of razor sharp teeth. So next time you go wild swimming take care as you may just come out with less than you went in!

Why not purchase yourself a permit and see if you can catch one. I've caught plenty over the years and if you don't, hey-ho, you've enjoyed all the other wildlife and fresh air, but watch out for those teeth if you do!

Something to look out for this month: how about a barn owl. With our lovely long evenings get out into the countryside and just before dusk see if you can spot one quartering. If you're lucky you may see one during the day.

## Traffic works by Oxfordshire County Council (OCC)

OCC sent the following report on traffic works on the 15th May. These have also been sent in a shout out in mid-May:

# Update on the railway closure between Didcot and Oxford:

Network Rail engineers have made good progress on building the temporary structure that will support the Nuneham Viaduct bridge. Work to reopen the railway by 10 June is on track and Network Rail is working closely with us and local bus operators to also progress Oxford station improvements.

# Road closures affecting A34 in May and June:

National Highways will be carrying out essential repair work on the A34 at Wolvercote between 11 May and 26 June. This will involve a series of overnight and weekend carriageway closures of the A34 between the Pear Tree and Botley interchanges, with a diversion route in place.

We are aware of the inconvenience this is likely to cause, as the timing coincides with the closure of Botley Road for Network Rail's redevelopment of Oxford Station in addition to the railway closure south of Oxford. However, National Highways is not able to defer the works.

While this essential safety work is taking place, the northbound and southbound carriageways will be closed at different times to reduce the impact on other routes. National Highways will also collaborate with utility companies during this period so gas and water repairs can be carried out at the same time.

The A34 will be closed **southbound** between the Pear Tree and Botley interchanges:

Weekend: Friday 2 June, 9pm to Monday 5 June, 6am.

Overnight: Tuesday 6 June, 9pm to Wednesday 7 June, 6am

The A34 will be closed **northbound** between the Botley and Pear Tree interchanges:



# A WARM WELCOME FOR HALL'S NEW CEILING

RESIDENTS in Appleton and Eaton celebrate a potential 90% reduction in heat loss at the village hall, thanks to a new insulated ceiling funded by a grant from FCC Communities Foundation.

As energy prices go through the roof, the insulated ceiling, new web-based heating controls and LED lighting are designed to minimise heat wastage and slash the costs of running the hall.

As well as ensuring the many users of the hall are warm and heat is not wasted, the improvements also provide a welcome brighter interior to this popular but dated village facility.

FCC Communities Foundation is a not-for-profit organisation that funds environmentally friendly projects which meet a proven community need. Encouraged to find out more by Action with Communities in Rural England (ACRE), the Village Hall Committee was delighted to find that the Appleton project qualified and the formal application process began.

In due course, a grant from the Foundation to cover the full cost of improvements (£11, 557.60) was agreed.

Colin McGuire, Chairman of Appleton Village Hall Committee, says: "The hall is a focal point for the village and these improvements will make a real difference not only to the many people who use it, but also to the local environment generally".

"We are extremely grateful to FCC Communities Foundation for providing funding and to the FCC staff who were so very helpful at every stage of the application process. Without this support from the Foundation, we would not have been able to go ahead with this important energy saving work."

Replacement of the ceiling took four days to complete and was timed to cause the least amount of disruption to activities in the hall. These include community social events, charity fundraising and being a central venue for essential village organisations, such as the Parish Council, to meet.

Whether it is the Women's Institute, the Evergreen club for older members of the community, attendees at the regular exercise classes or coffee get-togethers held in the hall, the local community joins the Committee in expressing gratitude to the FCC Communities Foundation for granting the funding that made the transformation possible.
