Appleton church is one of 245 English churches dedicated to St Laurence (or Lawrence) – the 15th most common dedication in the country. St Laurence seems to have been particularly popular in this area, with the churches at Besselsleigh, Tubney, North and South Hinksey all having this dedication. It is likely the cult of St Laurence came to this country from Rome with St Augustine in the 6th century. Laurence is a Roman saint and was highly regarded there, with five ancient basilicas dedicated to him, including one built over his tomb. In the 7th century, Pope Vitalian sent relics of St Laurence to King Oswiu of Northumbria; and English dedications to St Laurence are known to go back to the 8th century. He is one of the few saints who survived the English reformation, with his commemoration day, August 10th, being included in the Church of England Calendar from 1552.

Who, then, was St Laurence and why did he become so popular? His existence and his martyrdom are documented but other stories about him are legend. Laurence was a deacon in Rome at the time of the Christian persecution ordered by Emperor Valerian. His bishop, Sixtus II, was beheaded in AD 258. Tradition has it that the Prefect of Rome then ordered Laurence to give up the Church's property and money to him within three days. Laurence quickly distributed what there was to the poor and sick and on the third day brought these people to the Prefect as 'the Church's treasures'. In anger, the Prefect ordered Laurence to be burnt on a gridiron over a fire.

Thus, the gridiron is the emblem of St Laurence; and he became patron saint of cooks and the poor. There are statues of St Laurence with a gridiron on the outside of our church over the South Porch door and on the lectern inside the church; and the story of his martyrdom is depicted in the Blackwell memorial window next to the pulpit.

What does the story of St Laurence mean for us today? His faithfulness to God in the face of persecution is an example for us, although in a society where we are free to believe and worship as we wish it is perhaps difficult for us to see ourselves in his place. Perhaps more relevant for us is the way Laurence saw true value and riches in the people of God, particularly the poor and sick, rather than in material possessions and monetary wealth; and that he saw the Church as being the community of God's people. Is this an example that can inspire us in the way we live and act as individuals, as a Church and as a village community.

On Sunday 13th August, three days after St Laurence's Day, we are having a Songs of Praise service at 4.00pm in St Laurence church. Please join us as part of our community to sing our favourite hymns and commemorate our patron saint, St Laurence.

Appleton History - Airfields 1

In 1900 airfields were unknown – the Wright brothers didn't fly until 1904. Forty years later there were at least 10 airfields within 10 miles of Appleton! The growth of the RAF and the threat of war lead to this. Early ones were of grass – very kind to light aircraft – as at the north end of Port Meadow in 1911. Later paved airfields – were built in huge numbers. Usually there would be a main airfield plus extra satellite, reserve and training fields.

The nearest was at Black Horse Farm at Gozzard's Ford – a simple north-south grass strip. Next was another grass airfield at Kingston Bagpuize – a relatively large double runway grass field; also used by the USAF in WW2. The present Kingston Business Park is built on the site; the original Nissen huts are now businesses and the Control Tower still stands.

Twenty miles north is Enstone Airfield – still active. In 1944 a squadron of unmarked black Lancaster bombers arrived – in extreme secrecy. The atomic bomb was designed in Birmingham and developed in Los Alamos. But – the USAF didn't have a bomber that could carry it to Japan! The Lancasters were extensively modified in preparation to bomb Japan. The US tried their utmost to make a suitable B-29 and eventually succeeded just in time. It is

said that the Enstone Lancasters were kept in reserve to carry the British atomic bomb until 1955 when the Valiant bomber entered service.

Greatest Of All Time

Thirty six years ago I met a very special person who soon after became my wife - her nickname was Goat or Goaty. She shares this name with some of the flora and fauna of Great Britain such as Goat Willow, Goat's Beard, Goat Moth and the good old Goat itself.

Goat Willow - also known as Pussy Willow. A native tree that

can grow to 10m high and reach the grand old age of 300. It's also very beneficial to wildlife. Goat Willow foliage is eaten by the caterpillars of a number of moths. It's also the main food plant for the elusive and regal Purple Emperor butterfly. The catkins provide an important early source of pollen and nectar for bees and other insects, and birds use it to forage for caterpillars and insects.

Goat's Beard - a stately member of the daisy family. The yellow flower-heads are solitary with eight bracts united at the base. The parsnip like roots of this plant were once dug up and stored over winter to eat as a vegetable, and the young shoots were boiled and eaten like asparagus. Its folklore name is Jack-go-to-bed-at-noon because its flowers are usually open only from four o'clock in the morning till midday in June and July.

Goat Moth - the common name is derived from its caterpillars' musty 'goaty' odour. The caterpillars feed inside the trunks of a wide variety of deciduous trees such as willow, oak, apple and ash. The Goat Moth is unlikely to be mistaken for any other species in the British Isles - when fully grown the caterpillar is 100mm in length and the moth has a wingspan of up to 84mm.

Goat - here are a few Goat facts: You may know that a baby goat is called a kid, but did you know that, because of that, a goat giving birth is said to be 'kidding'? I'm not joking. Goats don't have teeth on their upper jaw. Goats have rectangular pupils. Goat's have four stomachs. Goat's milk is the most popular milk worldwide. Cashmere comes from Goats.
