

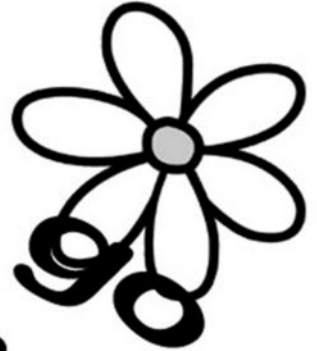
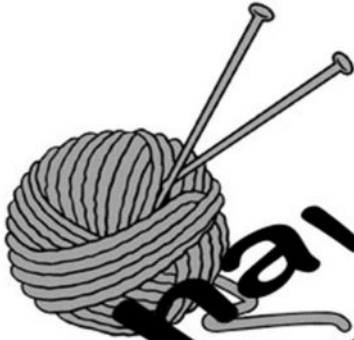

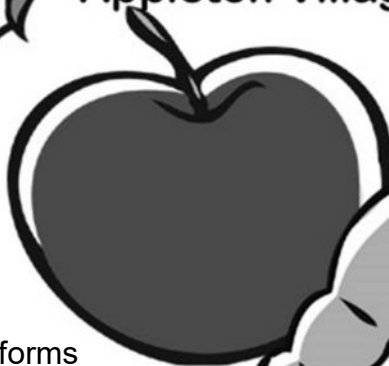

friend and I recently discussed how life is often best measured in eras, rather than years. These eras tend to be marked by an overarching theme; the place we live, our children's schooling, the health of our parents, our stage of career or how we choose to spend our retirement.

The changing of an era can sneak up on us and pass subtly or be marked by a single defining event. The death of a loved one is often the hardest shift to adjust to. The era of life with that person is a world apart from life without them and many in our community live with that adjustment daily.

All of us though will have some experience of the changing of the seasons of life; indeed it is said that "change is the only constant in life". Parents will have felt a pang of sadness in amongst the celebrations as their youngsters finished school for the final time this Summer – mourning the passing of childhood. Those new to our communities will have a sense of excitement, but also of trepidation as they remember with familiarity the homes they have left behind. And retirement can be a daunting prospect for those who, for many years, have found a purpose in the daily pursuit of work.

The community at St Laurence have started our own transition period over recent months. Having said goodbye to our Rector, Reverend Phil, we now look forward with prayer and anticipation to whomever is to be appointed as our new incumbent. In all of this, we take great comfort from the message the bible speaks into changing times, just as into times of stability. It is so often exactly what we need to hear, giving us a unique (and eternal) perspective on our own experiences.

The eras of modern history are split most fundamentally into B.C. (Before Christ) and A.D. (Anno Domini – the year of our Lord). For ancient historians the coming of Jesus changed everything, marking a fundamental transition point for all humanity. Perhaps surprisingly though, the bible claims that what is true for the world at large is also true for each and every one of us on an individual level. Life 'B.C.' is fundamentally different to life 'A.D.' and it is this distinction, above all others, that marks the two great eras of our lives. This distinction is so essential that Jesus talks of it in terms of having "crossed over from death to life", and of becoming a "new creation". Energy Costs for Freezers and Chillers

You may have noticed that we have not one, but two broken chillers in the Shop: one from Coca Cola which we've had for years and one of the chillers against the far wall. The breakdowns are not linked but have presented us with a timely opportunity to rethink the amount of chiller and freezer space the shop really needs.



For reasons you will all be fully aware of, our electricity bill has more than doubled from around £7,500 a year to over £15,000 (and still rising) and is rapidly becoming unsustainable without increasing our margins to cover the increased costs. The shop's directors and management don't want to take this course of action and, as we don't foresee any significant price reductions coming along any time soon, we will both be replacing the two old and high energy units for newer more efficient ones and also reducing the total amount of chiller and freezer space available in the

shop. We hope to do this without any significant decrease in the lines we offer.

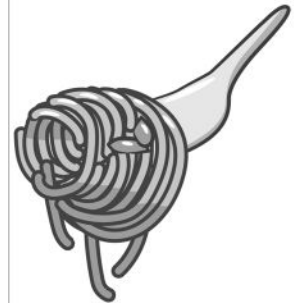
Over the coming few weeks you will notice some changes which we hope to manage with the least inconvenience to you, our customers – however, persuading different suppliers to remove old equipment and replace it with new equipment at the same time seems to be a big ask! Therefore, please don't be concerned if you see spaces appearing where you don't expect; it is all part of the master plan to keep your shop sustainable, solvent and supplying the village with what it needs for many years to come!

Friday night supper club

Italian sausage balls with pasta

- Michael Cain pork sausages
- 1 large teaspoon fennel seeds (grind them a bit)
- Onion (finely chopped)
- 1 large clove (finely chopped)
- 1 tin chopped tomatoes
- Pasta – your choice

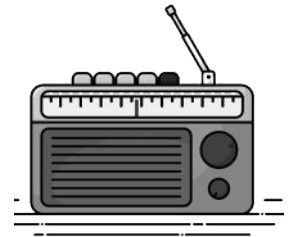


1. Cut sausages into quarters and fry until brown
2. Fry onions in olive oil until translucent, add chopped garlic when almost done.
3. Mix all ingredients in the pan, add salt and pepper, bring up to boil then turn down and leave bubbling slowly on low heat for 30 min to cook through
4. c.15 min before the end of cooking time fill a large pan with water and bring to boil, add salt and pasta and cook for 1 min less than it says on packet. Drain, but keep c.1-2 tablespoon of cooking water. Add pasta back to pan with cooking liquid and add meatballs and sauce. Stir to mix and serve with grated Parmesan cheese.

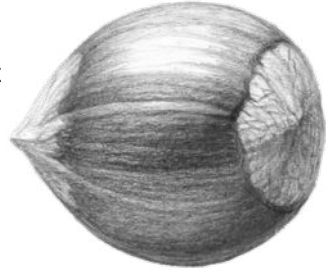

“Nuts, whole hazelnuts, uumh!”

Cadburys won't be taking mine and covering 'em in chocolate because the local squirrels have polished most of them off. But just what has been nibbling at your nuts? Have you ever picked up discarded hazelnut shells and found a smooth, round hole in its side? That would have been made by a dormouse or hazel dormouse and it can take 20 minutes for one to gnaw through it. Two birds that love a hazelnut treat are the nuthatch and the greater spotted woodpecker. These sometimes wedge a nut into the crevices of bark so that they can hammer at it more easily.



Still on the nutty theme but this time acorns and jays. This is a great time to see jays as they will be collecting and caching thousands of these to see them through the leaner months. Not all are retrieved and some go on to become oak trees. There are no jays without acorns and far fewer oaks without jays. The Latin name for the jay is *Garrulus glandarius*, 'garrulus' meaning noisy or chatty and 'glandarius' meaning 'of acorns'. Acorns are the primary food source for a jay.

And how can you not love a conker fresh from its shell - the colour and sheen is like a fine piece of antique Cuban mahogany.

As dusk gets earlier why not head out and look for badgers feeding on fruit and nuts, and digging for worms and insect larvae. Head to a sett before sunset and sit quietly – you may be lucky to see them emerge and feed!

Archaeologists have recently found a mummy while excavating a tomb in Egypt. Oddly enough, the mummy was covered in chocolate and hazelnuts. They believe it to be the tomb of Pharaoh Rocher.

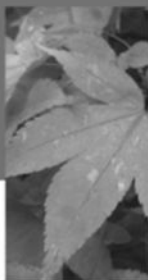

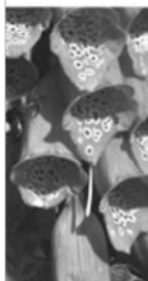
