## Candlemas



In last month's Advertiser Pete talked about the Christian Feast of Epiphany and noted that January 6<sup>th</sup>, as the twelfth day after Christmas, is traditionally the day when we take down the Christmas decorations. I wondered then whether you have ever been involved in the argument as to whether the Christmas decorations have to be down **by** or **on** 6<sup>th</sup> of January? Well, if you follow the Christian calendar you don't need to take them down until 2<sup>nd</sup> February, 40 days after the birth of Jesus!

Candlemas, also known as the Feast of the Presentation of Jesus Christ, commemorates the presentation of baby Jesus (in accordance with Jewish law) at the Temple 40 days after his birth and it falls on 2<sup>nd</sup> February. (Luke 2: 22-40) It marks the end of the Christmas-Epiphany season and in many Christian countries Christmas decorations are taken down at Candlemas and not, as is usually the case here in the UK, at Twelfth Night which is Epiphany Eve.

It is also the date, in some protestant countries, that Christians take their candles to their local church where they are blessed then used for the rest of the year. Candles serve as a symbol of Jesus Christ who is the Light of the World. At St Laurence we do not use donated candles, but the donation box is still there for the candles which are being sent on to Ukraine to make 'trench candles' for use by soldiers on the front line and civilians sheltering in bombed out basements who are without heat and light. So why not bring your used Christmas candles to St Laurence and donate them to 'Candles for Ukraine'. We began collecting candles last June and so far have sent three large boxes of them to the charity 'Inlight Ukraine', and we have another two boxes ready to go. Please put your old candles in the box by the door just inside the church.




### **Appleton Voluntary Transport Scheme (AVTS)**

## Appleton history – a near miss

Hatford is a small hamlet about eight miles west of Appleton.

The peace of the hamlet – population c100 over the last 1,000 years – has been upset twice. Recently in WW2 a German bomb was dropped on it – probably dumped as excess payload; it killed three youngsters – two of whom had been evacuated there from London.



Bigger bangs had occurred in 1628. The people around heard two great explosions and the rushing of air before two sky borne rocks crashed into their fields. One weighing about 65 pounds and a lesser one of 25 pounds. Given their estimated direction of flight they may have passed over Appleton seconds earlier that day – 9 April; the explosions were sonic booms.

The events were quickly attributed to divine intervention - God had set up celestial cannons to warn English folk of the dangers of their unholy life style. Rumours evolved rapidly together with illustrations of the account; news of the event spread far and wide.

Two farmers approached the larger rock – in their minds God's rock - and tried to dig it out of the ground – watched in awe by the gathered villagers. The younger of the two fainted from emotional stress.

Despite the attention it received no remnants of the meteorites are known of. They are thought to have been stony meteorites and may have merged into the landscape.



### Shrove Tuesday pancakes

We have everything you need to enjoy a pancake-filled day on 13<sup>th</sup> February: flour, eggs, lemons, milk... Why not try the recipe below which uses Carole's marmalade to make a pancake feast.

### Marmalade pancakes

100g plain flour : 2 eggs : 300ml milk

1. Mix everything to a smooth batter – leave it to rest for about 20 minutes (it will thicken).
2. Heat a frying pan and wipe it with oiled kitchen paper (or melt butter in the pan and wipe it out). When hot (not too hot), pour in a large spoonful of the batter and roll around the pan, it will be cooked underneath when dry on top. Flip over to cook the other side. (The first one is usually a failure!) Repeat.
3. To serve, gently heat the marmalade of your choice and pour over generously.

### **Appleton with Eaton Flood Group**

As you will all be aware, there was a flooding incident in early January. The Council thanks all of those who came out to assist.

Appleton with Eaton has a Flood Group which is a working group of the Parish Council. The group meets at least once a year to review action plans, discuss equipment needed, etc.

This group is looking for more members. If you would be interested in joining this group, especially if you have been affected by the recent floods, please email/phone the Clerk (see details below).

There will also be a WhatsApp group for the Flood Group as well as anyone who would like to be a part of it for reasons such as communicating any issues, asking for assistance, etc. Please contact the Clerk if you would like to join this group.

The Council will be purchasing (and may have purchased by the time of delivery of the Advertiser) 150 aqua sacs which will be kept in the Village Hall. The Council will also be purchasing additional flood signs.

The Council would also ask that anyone who has ditches affecting drainage to keep them clear so as to assist in the event of heavy rainfall which is bound to be a more regular occurrence.

### **20mph survey**

The results of the speed survey were discussed at the meeting of the Parish Council on Monday the 8<sup>th</sup> January. The Council has put together all of the results and comments and sent those to Oxfordshire County Council for their information in preparing their consultation.

## Letter to the PM about Oxford Flood Alleviation Scheme

Rishi Sunak visited Oxford and Abingdon on January 7 and announced the government was investing £5.2-billion in flood defenses. Now residents have written to him challenging him to back up the pledges with decisive action.

They said that the proposed Oxford Flood Alleviation Scheme (OFAS) is not a good solution, and also that the proposed channel is unnecessary (when alternatives exist). Canon Sugden said: "We wanted him to know that these local schemes are often rushed through without full public consultation, and all too often, cheaper and quicker alternatives are overlooked"

The current CPO (Compulsory Purchase Order) public enquiry into the OFAS ends on 26 January.
