

Milestones in an Empty Month – Making the most of August by the Revd Wealands Bell, Rector

Even for those who have to work, or who can barely remember when they sat and waited for the last school-bell of July to ring, and send them out into the sun-and-fun of the six-week summer holiday, the arrival of August can be a happy punctuation mark in the year's relentlessness, a great square patchwork of empty days, a foretaste of eternity, and expanse of purposeless hours to be filled exactly as we will.

That said, I would feel entirely at sea in a cavernous month like August, without the markers and milestones provided by the feasts of the Christian calendar. Here are five of my favourites – summertime invitations to step into a different story, and allow it to shape our own.

<u>August 6th</u>. The Transfiguration. Nothing to do with Harry Potter, this refers to Jesus on a mountain with his friends, seen to be filled with the glorious presence of God. His face shines and his clothes are dazzling white, brighter than any detergent could achieve. A different sort of fiery light illumines <u>August 10th</u>, when our patron St Laurence, 3rd-century Roman martyr, is celebrated for championing the city's poorest, and his consequent execution on a gridiron. An equally dramatic tale is told on <u>August 14th</u>, when we commemorate St Maximilian Kolbe, the priest who, in Auschwitz in 1941, volunteered to change places with a married man condemned to death by starvation. Kolbe was eventually executed by lethal injection. The next day, <u>August 15th</u>, is the great Catholic celebration of the Assumption into heaven of the Blessed Virgin, a mediaeval festival that affirms the faith that Mary's cooperation with God places her body-and-soul in the divine heart. It reminds us of the true nature of humanity: we come from God; we return to God, and have inexpressibly greater dignity than we might otherwise imagine.

We end with another martyrdom. On <u>August 29th</u>, Christians recall the grisly story of the beheading of John the Baptist, ordered by King Herod Antipas when John continued to criticise his marriage to Herodias, his sometime sister-in-law. You probably remember the scene in which Salome, Herodias' daughter, dances so pleasingly for Herod's party guests, that he promises her any gift, 'up to half his Kingdom'. At her mother's prompting, she viciously demands 'the head of John the Baptist on a plate.' Herod, after promising so publicly, must have John executed. Moral: never make extravagant promises when you're well into the second bottle.

I dare say you're finding these strange commemorations too bloody by half for the summer holidays. And you'd have a point. I love them because they remind me of what I could be; what anyone can be, when courage and truth are ignited by a faith in more than ourselves. It's especially in a time of idleness that a project greater than our own can give to our days a purpose, and a lasting significance.

The first meeting of the Autumn season of the Appleton with Eaton History Group will take place on:


Thursday Sept 25th, in the village hall committee room as usual, starting at 7.30 pm. Anybody is welcome.

We would love to set a challenge for the summer – can you find a species that has not yet been identified in our community? Besselsleigh Woods is home to hundreds of different plants and animals – maybe you can find one more during the holidays!

Download the i-Naturalist App and enjoy taking photos of wildlife. We would love to find out more about biodiversity in our area. When you upload your pictures, you can add a note to say 'Appleton School Challenge' (with your name and year group if you would like) and we will share some of your wonderful photos in School Newsletters next term.

Appleton History - A mystery within the Church

The most desirable burial place within a church is next to the Altar. From there priority moves outward into the wider graveyard. It is a great surprise that a 13-year-old girl from far away was buried - in 1770 - right next to the Altar. She was Elizabeth WILSON – far from her family – over 4.000 miles away.

Elizabeth was the daughter of Charles WILSON Esq of the Caribbean Island of Grenada – an island about 100 miles offshore of South America. I have no knowledge of the WILSON family and how Elizabeth came to be in Appleton – and sadly dying here. Most Europeans in the Caribbean at that time were employed in the evolving farming and shipping trades.

There remains the great puzzle of why Elizabeth was given this most exalted place of burial amidst the great and the good of Appleton.


There is another mystery – possibly related. The Rector that oversaw Elizabeth's burial was the Rev Thomas WINCHESTER. He must have been intimately involved

in arranging Elizabeth's interment – but why did he act so?

The Rev WINCHESTER died ten years after Elizabeth and is buried about ten feet away from the altar – much as one would have expected.

After the rector's death it emerged that he held some 40,000 books – an astonishing quantity in 1780 for a country rector. These were later sold at auction in London by T Payne & Son.

Was there a connection between the rector's 40,000 books and Elizabeth's interment? A mystery that deserves some study.
