The roll-call of the honoured – Reading our loved ones' names each November

Wealands Bell – Rector of Appleton with Besselsleigh

And so we are into the deep and darkening Autumn as the year turns, and the first quarter of the century is nearly done. On our All Souls' list in church, new names are added, as time's ever-rolling stream continues its relentless passage, depriving us of friends-and-family loved-ones, and of neighbours in our tight-knit villages. We imagine such lists to be little more than *aides-mémoire*, useful crib-sheets to help us minimise our forgetfulness, a sort of shopping-list of remembrances.

But lists can be rather more than that, especially these November lists that record the departed and the fallen; or the names of those lost to an institution in the previous twelve months. Such lists have a sacred quality, however scrappy the bit of paper they're written on. This stems from the inviolable dignity of every human being, not in consequence of their possessions or achievements, their rank in society or other victories over time and circumstance. Their names matter, and deserve attentive silence when read aloud (at the Requiem on All Souls' Day, or at the Memorial on Remembrance Sunday) very simply because they are the names of those born of woman.

Those whose names are carved on our war memorial no doubt began to display their characters as children in our school, where the contours of their perhaps warshortened lives began to be formed and made visible, in the classroom and on the playground. It was here that, in Wordsworth's phrase, the child began to show himself 'father of the man' he would later become. And when today's children make their way towards the school gate, splendid in their Appleton green, we see in them, too, examples of absolute human dignity, fellow-citizens worthy of our careful attention.

In all probability, when passing a memorial or reading a list of the departed, we simply register the names, and walk on. But for some, one name will stand out from the others, be known, recognised with affection and the happy recollection of younger days, when all was an energetic present and promising future. These named lives began like ours, and, like ours, matured uniquely on the stage of time, carving out their own testament and trajectory for many years, or few. Like John Donne's passing bell that 'tolls for thee', each of these names implies and begins to inscribe our own name, inviting us to consider our own use of time; to note who and how we have been so far, to wonder how we must live to do justice to the bright-eyed youngster we once were, racing across the playground, dutifully learning our lists of verbs and dates, scoring goals or squeezing words from an unwilling pen, while the bell cruelly refused to ring.

To all the departed this November, we bid eternal rest, mindful that one day we will be joining them. To those grieving the loss of loved ones, we wish strength and comfort. And for us all, we seek joy, peace and encouragement, this day and ever.

November News - Winter Wildlife

Bees in Winter

Heading into the cold winter months, we need to be even more considerate to our local bees than usual. In winter, honeybee queens remain in their hives with the exception of particularly sunny days. Bumblebee queens may also emerge from hibernation if prompted to by mild weather. Solitary bees will leave their nests once ready to



mate. When bees do emerge during winter, they need to have access to nectar, or they risk dying of starvation. In order to help these pollinators survive the winter, we recommend you plant winter bloomers in your garden. These include single flowered Hellebores (the open face gives great access to pollen and nectar!), Crocuses (make sure to plant them in an area with lots of light so they fully open), Snowdrops and Aconites. Ivy also works well as a late nectar source as well as shelter from any harsh conditions. If gardening isn't your thing, you can make natural spaces bee friendly by creating twig and leaf piles (which can be as easy as not raking your garden when fallen leaves drop!) and caring for wayward queen bumblebees by either carefully relocating them to flowers or offering her a 1:1 sugar and water solution.



Tips for looking after our hedgehogs this winter

Always move your burn piles before you light them as hedgehogs and frogs often use them to sleep in. This is, after-all, how hedgehogs were once upon a time cooked to be eaten! Thankfully it is now illegal to eat this endangered species.

If you find a sick or injured

hedgehog, or one that's up and about during the middle of the day, call either Oxfordshire Wildlife Rescue centre on <u>07549322464</u> or Tiggywinkle's wildlife hospital on <u>01844 292292</u>.

Leave some areas untouched! Messy log piles, long grass and fallen leaves are great for hibernating hedgehogs. Please leave a wild area in your garden so our hedgehogs can hibernate in peace - nice and cosy and safe.

Put out a shallow dish of water or make sure your ponds are easy to get out of for hedgehogs, so they have water to drink. Sometimes hedgehogs come out of hibernation to eat and drink, especially in warmer weather, so even at this time of year, putting out water can help.

Avoid using pesticides or herbicides as this will make hedgehogs very ill. Find out more at www.hedgehogrescue.org.uk


Also, a call out to any local crafters – would you like a stall at the fair to sell your wares?

Oxford temporary congestion charge

Starting Wednesday 29 October there will be a temporary congestion charge on six roads in Oxford.

Cars with permits and all other vehicles can pass through the charge locations for free. If you don't have a permit you will need to pay £5 per day to drive a car through the six congestion charge locations.

The locations and operating times

Marston Ferry Road and Hollow Way -Monday to Saturday at peak times between 7am to 9am and 3pm to 6pm Hythe Bridge Street, St Cross Road, St Clement's and Thames Street - Monday to Sunday from 7am to 7pm



There will be directional signs providing advance warning of the charging locations. Traffic signs will show when and where the congestion charge applies to cars. Automatic number plate recognition (ANPR) cameras will enforce the restrictions.

Permits types and how to apply

Oxfordshire residents can apply for permits with a limited number of day passes. Permits are available for blue badge holders, community health and care workers, mobile traders and many other groups, allowing them to drive through the charge locations without incurring a charge.

You can apply for and manage your permit online. Register for a free online account, select the permit you are applying for and upload the required documents. If you're unable to apply online, you can apply by phone – 01865 519800.

At the end of the day, though, I am happiest in my natural state among the grasses and plants on my hillside, waving in the breeze, saying hello to the butterflies, bees and creatures which pass by - even a bustling rabbit.


